Helsinki, Finland - 23-27 November 2009

What is a Cultural Coach?

A Cultural Coach is a person who makes the bridge between a cultural minority and the Youth in Action programme (and the National Agency).

The Cultural Coach works in two directions; he/she promotes the Youth in Action programme in the targeted communities and supports them in participating in the YiA programme, e.g. by coaching groups of young people to develop a youth initiative, doing research on the barriers faced by the community to enter YiA, facilitating an advanced planning visit between a group and their European partners, supporting a group to fill in the application form for a youth exchange, participating in a meeting with the ministry on inclusion policies for young people, helping the NA to understand the cultural context of the community, etc. At the same time, the Cultural Coach is a resource person for the National Agency, providing the NA insight and information about the realities and the context of the young people in the communities involved.

Each NA will identify the Cultural Coach(es) they will work with on a long term approach. At the moment, the profiles of Cultural Coaches are very diverse: most of them are youth workers and comes from the cultural community they will work with, but that's not an obligation. They can have implemented YiA projects yet or not. The only requirements are that they are directly link with young people and the cultural minority, and speak enough English to participate in an international seminar.

The seminar "Cultural Coach" will offer a space for each NA together with their Cultural Coach to work on a strategy/action plan for the future to bridge cultural minorities with YiA.

Objectives

The aim of the overall project is to support and train representatives from cultural minorities who would then act as a bridge between the NA and cultural minorities. The project will in the end result in little changes in the NAs' daily practice, but certainly with a big impact on the young people involved.

This seminar is the second step of a long term strategy in order to bridge cultural minorities with the Youth in Action programme:

- 1/ First step in January 2009 with some NA representatives: to build the first bases
- 2/ Seminar in Helsinki
- 3/ International event in 2010: precise contents will be decided in Helsinki with all the participants of the seminar, regarding their needs

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The **objectives** of the seminar are:

- To identify the needs and challenges of the cultural communities
- To map the existing skills and competences of the cultural coaches and NA staff and identify their needs in terms of future learning
- To build a common language among participants on concepts such as non formal education, intercultural learning and the Youth in Action programme as a tool.
- To design the concrete next steps at national and international levels aiming at more inclusion of cultural minorities

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Participants

The Cultural Coach is usually a representative of his/her community. If the Cultural Coach is not from the community, he/she should have contacts and previously worked with the community.

If it's not possible for the NA to participate, we recommend that you send a regional coordinator, local contact point or trainer strongly link with the NA who could act as the NA.

All participants (NAs and Cultural Coaches) should be ready to work on a long term approach. This seminar is just a start for you to implement your own strategy!
