

Statistics of SALTO-YOUTH Activities in 2011

In 2011 SALTO Network organized **124** educational events for youth workers, NAs and youth policy makers (**114** in 2010).

This was **94** activities:

- **28** regular EVS trainings in SEE region (**33** in 2010)
- **16** regular EVS trainings in EECA region (**0** in 2010?)
- **15** activities to support the YiA and its structure (**16** in 2010)
- **20** seminars, conferences, expert meetings and events (**10** in 2010)
- **12** training courses (**17** in 2010)
- **2** contact making and partnership building activities (**3** in 2010)
- **1** study visits (**2** in 2010)

As well as 9 module trainings consisting of 30 separate activities (10 modules of 33 activities in 2010)

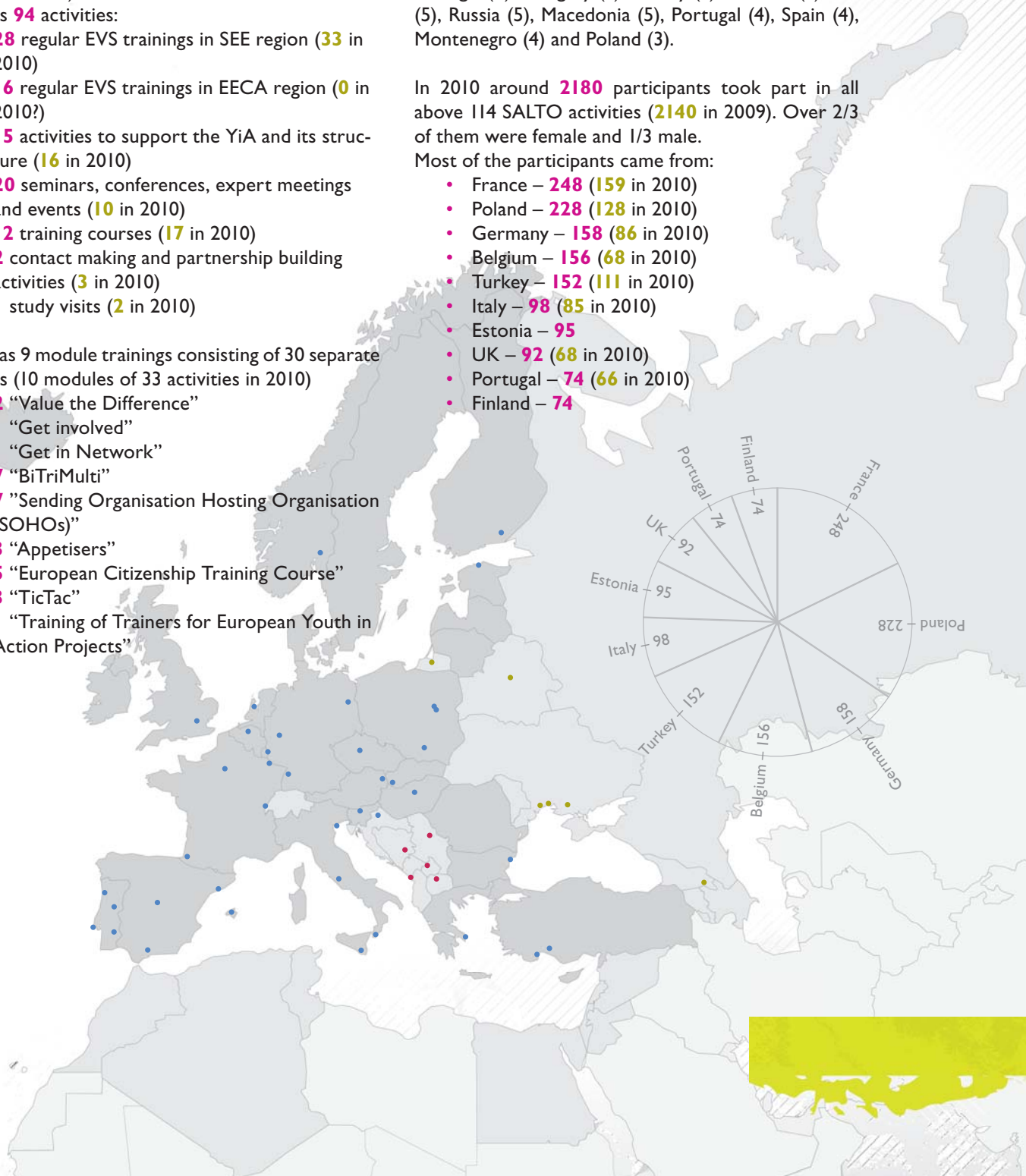

SALTO Network activities were hosted in 35 countries, the most popular were: France (14), Belgium (7), Georgia (7), Hungary (6), Turkey (6), Ukraine (6), UK (5), Russia (5), Macedonia (5), Portugal (4), Spain (4), Montenegro (4) and Poland (3).

In 2010 around **2180** participants took part in all above 114 SALTO activities (**2140** in 2009). Over 2/3 of them were female and 1/3 male.

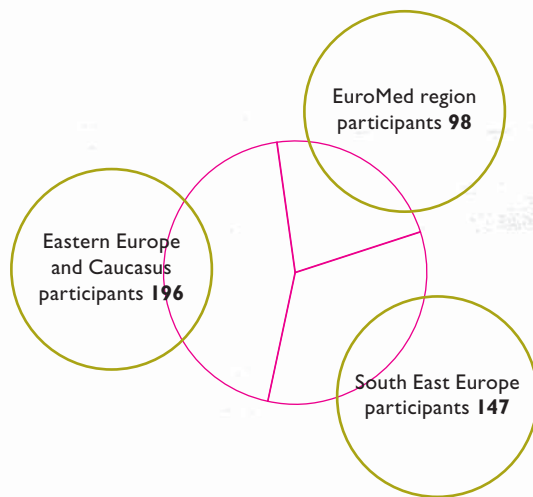
Most of the participants came from:

- France – **248** (**159** in 2010)
- Poland – **228** (**128** in 2010)
- Germany – **158** (**86** in 2010)
- Belgium – **156** (**68** in 2010)
- Turkey – **152** (**111** in 2010)
- Italy – **98** (**85** in 2010)
- Estonia – **95**
- UK – **92** (**68** in 2010)
- Portugal – **74** (**66** in 2010)
- Finland – **74**



Out of Programme Countries, we managed to host from:

- South East Europe **147** participants (**300** in 2010) – most of them from Former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia, Serbia and Albania.
- Eastern Europe and Caucasus **196** participants (**109** in 2010) – most popular from Ukraine, Armenia and Russian Federation.
- EuroMed region **98** participants (**115** in 2010) – most popular from Israel, Jordan, and Palestinian Authority.



In general participants from Non-Programme Countries at SALTO activities in 2011 made 26% of the total number.

Although we worked with all National Agencies of the YiA programme, the most active partnership the Network had with National Agencies of:

- NA France – **17** common activities (**15** in 2010)
- NA Turkey – **7** (**8** in 2010)
- NA Hungary **7** (**5** in 2010)
