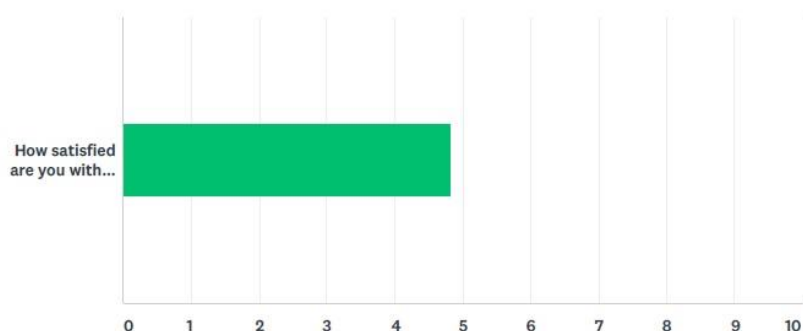
Participant Evaluation Summary



Overall satisfaction

The overall satisfaction level is very high (4.82/5.00) with 82% of participants recording the highest level of satisfaction (5).

Achievement of seminar objectives

Over 90% of participants have evaluated the achievement of objectives very positively (4 or 5). The highest notes (over 60% highest scores) were received for:

- To exchange ways of working together and methods of intervention in inclusion of young people
- To get to know different realities and sharing good practices in cross-sectoral work with young people

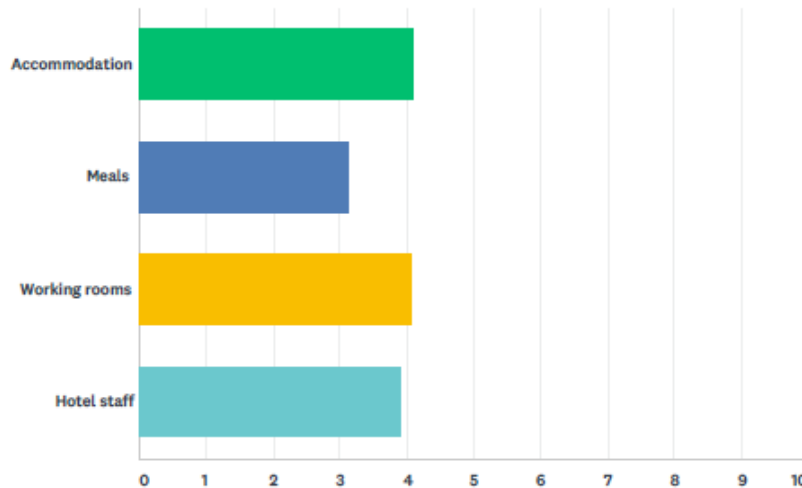
This was followed by two objectives with over 50% highest scores:

- To explore strengths and weaknesses of cross-sectoral approaches targeting young people with fewer opportunities, notably Roma youth
- To stimulate the development of cross-sectoral projects for young people with fewer opportunities, notably Roma youth within the framework of the Erasmus+ Programme

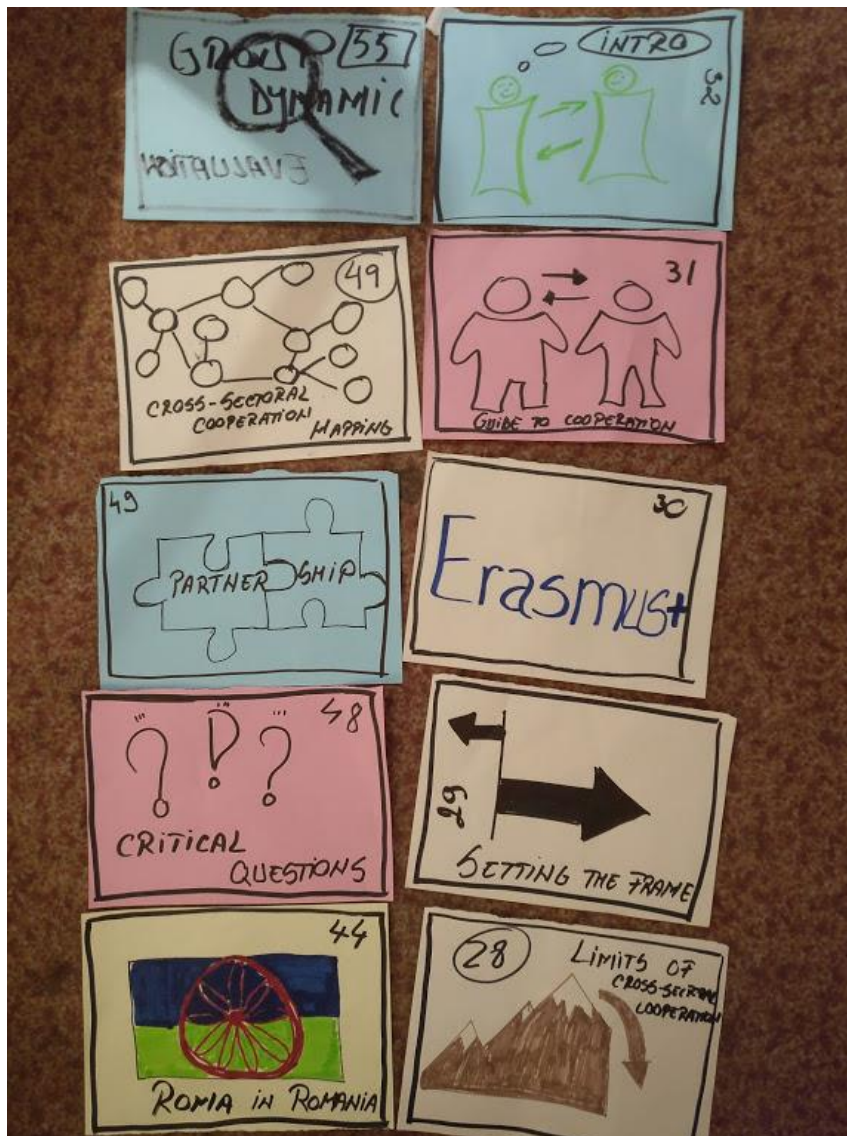

Majority of participants were very satisfied with communication before and during the seminar as well as materials received. An overwhelming majority of the participants were very appreciative of group dynamics (80% participants have given this aspect of the programme the highest note).

- Meals 3.14
- Working rooms 4.05
- Hotel staff 3.91

Programme



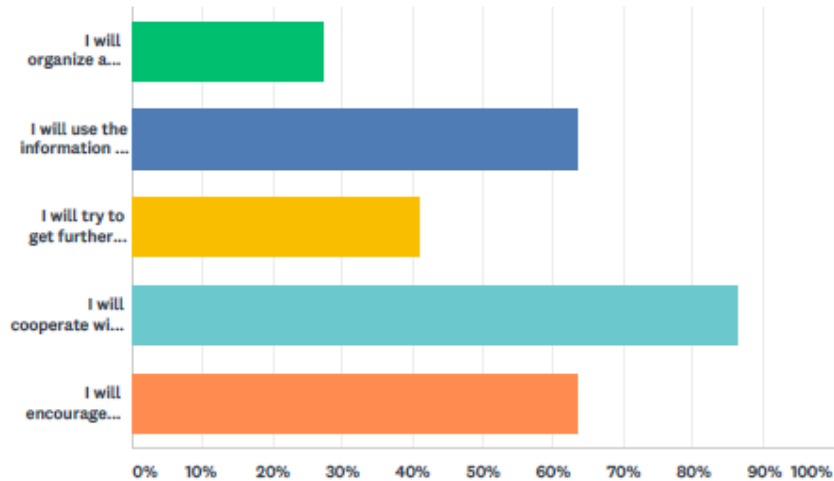
Over 70% of the participants were very satisfied with methods used. During the creative evaluation session, participants have rated the programme blocks/aspects in the following fashion (see photo below - from highest positive score to lowest):

- Group dynamic - 55
- Cross-sectoral co-operation mapping – 49
- Partnership – 49
- Critical questions – 48
- Roma in Romania – 44
- Introduction – 32
- Guide to cross-sectoral co-operation 31
- Erasmus+ - 30
- Setting the frame – 29
- Limits of cross-sectoral co-operation - 28

The seminar's partnership-building element resonated most with participants: 85% declared that they 'will cooperate with other people I met in this TC to start a project/activity'.

Over 60% will 'use the information and methods learned in projects and activities' and 'encourage people to apply inclusive methods in their activities'.

Over 60% of participants also plan to apply for Erasmus+ funding.
