## 1. Framework of the IPP meeting

### 1.1. Background of the IPP meeting

Since the YOUTH Programme started in 2000, the European Commission launched several calls for Innovative (formerly called Large-scale) projects. Between 2000 and 2004, 62 Innovative projects were approved by the Commission; please find further detailed information at [http://europa.eu.int/comm/youth/program/call\\_action\\_5\\_en.html](http://europa.eu.int/comm/youth/program/call_action_5_en.html) (the web page of the EC to launch calls) or at <http://www.salto-youth.net/innovativeprojects> (SALTO's database to support the visibility of the approved projects).

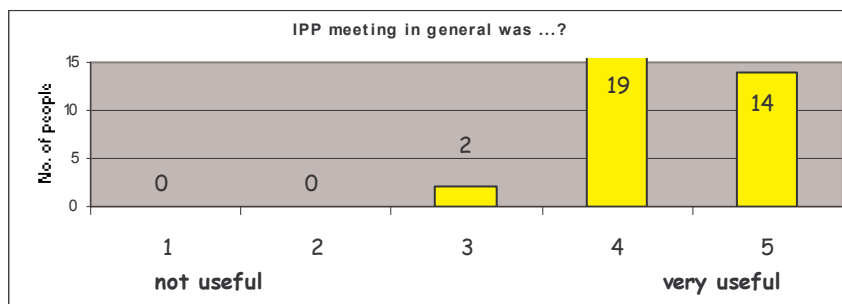
Within the context of this Action 5 Call for Innovative projects, the European Commission aims to support innovative co-operation, training, and information projects in the field of non-formal education. The projects must have a clear transnational European dimension and contribute to European co-operation in youth matters.

In 2002, a first meeting of six Innovative project promoters took place which was organised by the European Commission and the Technical Assistance Office (TAO). The meeting aimed to inform the Commission Youth Unit about these projects more in detail and thus to contribute to the aim of monitoring these activities better. It also provided an opportunity for the project leaders to exchange ideas and good practise on non-formal education and gave them the opportunity to create an informal network of support for their projects and to discuss shared difficulties that they may face.

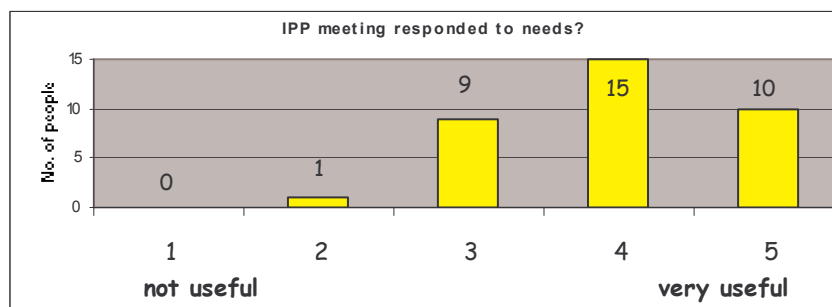
From 5 to 7 September 2005, the second meeting for IPPs took place in Bonn / Germany. Beneficiaries of the 38 projects which had been approved between 2002 and 2004 were invited. The IPPs were invited to also nominate one partner organisation of their project in order to increase the effect of the meeting. The 33 YOUTH National Agencies and the eight SALTO–YOUTH Resource Centres were invited to join the meeting as well. The SALTO Training and Cooperation RC in co-operation with the European Commission organised the meeting.

Directly after this IPP meeting, the annual so-called “TCP seminar” for NAs, which aims to facilitate the coherent planning of NAs’ and SALTOs’ own support measure activities in order to support the implementation of the YOUTH Programme at national level, took place (7 - 11 September 2005) at the same venue. The TCP seminars are organised by the SALTO Training and Cooperation RC, and the idea was to link both events in order to create co-operation and synergy effects between the IPPs and the network of YOUTH NAs and SALTOs.

A large majority of the participants (94% or 33 out of 35) felt the meeting to be useful. On a scale from 1=not useful to 5=very useful, 54% rated the IPP meeting in general as useful and 40% as very useful.



This result is similarly positive as the answers to the one other overall question in the evaluation questionnaire about to what extent the IPP meeting responded to the participants' needs. 71% (or 25 out of 35) of the participants felt the seminar to be (very) useful. On a scale from 1=not useful to 5=very useful, 43% rated the IPP meeting as useful and 28% as very useful.

## 1.2. Aims and objectives

### The aims and objectives of this meeting were

- To exchange good practise;
- To stimulate co-operation and synergies between the stakeholders involved;
- To contribute to valorising the results of the Innovative/Large-scale projects.

The participants were asked in detail to what extent the aims and objectives were met. An average of 75% of the participants regarded the aims and objectives as (very) achieved. And discounting the comparably low rating for the very difficult to meet objective of “contributing to the valorisation of project results”, even an average of 85% evaluated the aims and objectives as (very) met. In general, the (very) good achievement (from 56% to 88%) of the aims and objectives set for the meeting can be regarded as a very positive result. For the detailed evaluation results of the different aims and objectives, please have a look at Annex 4.

## 1.3. Target group

23 out of 38 invited projects followed the invitation, in total 37 representatives joined the meeting. As the invitation was sent at the beginning of the summer holiday period 2005, this amount of participants can be seen as a very positive result which shows the high interest and commitment of the stakeholders involved – their willingness to look beyond their own nose within this context.

Unfortunately, only eight out of 33 NA representatives and two SALTOs managed to join the meeting. That the TCP seminar followed immediately afterwards, might be a reason for this relatively low participation which is understandable taking into consideration the amount of meetings NA and SALTO staff are facing per year and the existing limited time capacities available.

With regard to the IPPs, the majority of the participants met the required profile. They

- were involved in the implementation of the project,
- were informed about the results and their dissemination,
- were informed about their needs and / or offers with regard to their organisational interest to work in European activities,
- were able to commit interest and participation of their organisation with regard to possible co-operation and synergy projects expected as an outcome of the meeting.

## 1.4. Conclusions and preview

### 1.4.1. Co-operation aspects:

In an oral evaluation, the IPPs gave a very positive feedback on the meeting, highlighting especially the possibility to strengthen the network of IPPs which all project promoters deem very useful. The IPPs welcomed the opportunity to present their projects to a wider audience.

- Networking between the IPPs should be further reinforced, e.g. by future IPP meetings or by using Action 5 User's Guide activities. The NAs could, where appropriate, envisage funding follow-up activities of Innovative projects to ensure their sustainability.
- With regard to the co-operation between IPPs and National Agencies/SALTOs, it was stated that it would be important to use the skills and tools of Innovative projects while they are running. It could be envisaged making a reference to the use of Innovative projects in the NA work plans. Many of the IPPs would welcome a kind of mentorship of NA/SALTO representatives for their projects. The participants underlined that these links would need to find their reflection in IPP and also NA/SALTO contracts.
- The NAs should be better informed about and make better use of the results of the Innovative projects. The SALTO Training and Co-operation RC developed a database of Innovative projects ([www.salto-youth.net/innovativeprojects](http://www.salto-youth.net/innovativeprojects)) using the TAO compendia but introducing a device for searching. This database will allow to upload the results of Innovative projects.
- The IPPs highlighted that they see a need to strengthen further co-operation between local/regional authorities and project promoters to use synergies. It was proposed to include local/regional authorities in training activities organised by the National Agencies.
- With regard to the project management aspects, many of the IPPs asked for being better informed about financial and project management issues, because the financial complexity of this project type seems to be an obstacle for quite a few IPPs. One proposal was to create a SALTO chat forum on this issue. Lists with Frequently Asked Questions about project management issues should be published.

### 1.4.2. Valorisation

The participants welcomed Ms Degiampietro's inputs on valorisation and the discussions involved very much; please have a look at Chapter 2.2. for further information.

- There is a clear need on the beneficiaries' side for further input on issues such as needs analysis, project marketing, dissemination and valorisation. Needs analysis should get an even higher focus in the application form which should also explicitly make a reference to valorisation.
- The IPPs suggested that some Innovative projects should be promoted as examples of good practise ('centres of excellence') to inform about project results but also about the specific project type 'Innovative projects'. As for project marketing, the participants proposed to receive training on this issue by Commission, NAs or Executive Agency.

### 1.4.3. Follow-up meeting

A huge amount of the participants confirmed the value of this meeting and the need for further ones. In case the IPP meeting will be repeated in 2006, it should not take place directly before or after a TCP seminar, because the NA representatives would be out of office too long. Two separate meetings or both meetings at the same time and venue with common and different programme elements could allow more NAs to join the IPP meeting. In the Action Planning phase during the Open Space part of the meeting (see Annex 3; project No. 2), the co-ordination of a follow-up IPP meeting was proposed.

**“Which” innovation ?**

By nature, a close and final definition of “innovation” is impossible. Innovation, in this context, could be circumscribed as finding new ways of addressing topics or target groups, of combining working methods or partners in the field of trans-national youth work.

Innovation is about answering to specific needs in the youth field in a given time frame with a clear impact, efficiently using the means available.

## 2.2. European Commission's strategy for valorisation

The IPP meeting should support the valorisation of projects and their results – an important horizontal issue of the Commission in order to make best use of the approved activities. For more information, please have a look at [http://europa.eu.int/comm/dgs/education\\_culture/valorisation/index\\_en.html](http://europa.eu.int/comm/dgs/education_culture/valorisation/index_en.html). As additional information, please find below the PowerPoint presentation done by Elisabetta Degiampietro.

The outcomes of the two workshops on valorisation are:

### A. Suggestions for project promoters from the YOUTH Programme:

1. Projects should base activities on a clear needs analysis which takes place at project design stage (so to develop activities really responding to the demand in the field of youth) - for the moment this does not happen very often within the YOUTH Programme
2. Ongoing interaction between project partners and key stakeholders in the field of youth work is fundamental for the better quality of the project and in order to enhance the impact potential of the project
3. It is important to identify and use the most adequate information/dissemination channels (according to the target groups)
4. Personal contacts, participation in European events, face-to-face communication are still privileged ways to disseminate and transfer results (at least among YOUTH promoters)
5. It could be useful and more convenient for a project to rely on existing valorisation channels/instruments, like for example the SALTO database for innovative projects ([www.salto-youth.net/innovativeprojects](http://www.salto-youth.net/innovativeprojects)) or existing European networks, European events in the field of youth, etc.
6. Part of the project budget should be allocated to dissemination and exploitation activities
7. Valorisation must be a shared responsibility among all project partners: a high level of engagement in the partnership is therefore essential

*B. Suggestions for Commission/National Agencies:*

8. It is important to show examples of good practise from the YOUTH Programme in order to increase the visibility of the programme itself

9. The project promoters from the YOUTH Programme are lacking specific competencies in terms of valorisation/marketing: some supporting tools should be developed (small training sessions, guidelines, etc.)

10. The National Agencies play a fundamental role in implementing valorisation activities at national level and in supporting/guiding project promoters in the field of valorisation

11. Follow-up activities for YOUTH projects and project results could/should be planned in the future in order to support the promoters in valorisation. Some examples: support to networks for dissemination and exploitation of existing results; financing to 'excellence centres' (a way to support the further development of best practise from the YOUTH Programme)

12. Thematic meetings among project promoters would be very useful in order to exchange expertise on a specific topic and improve the quality of projects

13. A selection in two phases (including a meeting with the promoters of the pre-selected projects in order to guide/train them before submitting full proposals) could improve the quality of the final proposals (and finally of the selected projects)

**1. What is valorisation?**

Dissemination and exploitation of project outcomes, results, products, practices, processes

- with a view to optimising their value
- enhancing their impact
- integrating them into systems and practices at local, sectoral, regional, national and European level (to reach sustainability)

**NB: valorisation is more than dissemination**

**2. Why to do it?**

- ✓ Sustainability of project results (do not put results in the drawers!)
- ✓ Capitalization of investments
- ✓ Avoid re-inventing the wheel
- ✓ Transfer of results to innovate systems and practices
- ✓ Enhanced impact of programmes and projects
- ✓ Reduced timescales for policy innovation
- ✓ Feed the political processes (a tool to feed policy process with programme results - the bridge between policy and implementation of the policy)

➡ 2005: Commission develops a valorisation strategy for all EAC programmes (until 2004 only LdV had a systematic approach)  
Post 2006: valorisation as a key element in all new programmes

- Project conception:
  - ex-ante needs analysis of target group
  - clear identification of target group and final beneficiaries/stakeholders
  - anticipation of expected results
- During project development: interactivity between promoters & stakeholders (marketing approach!)

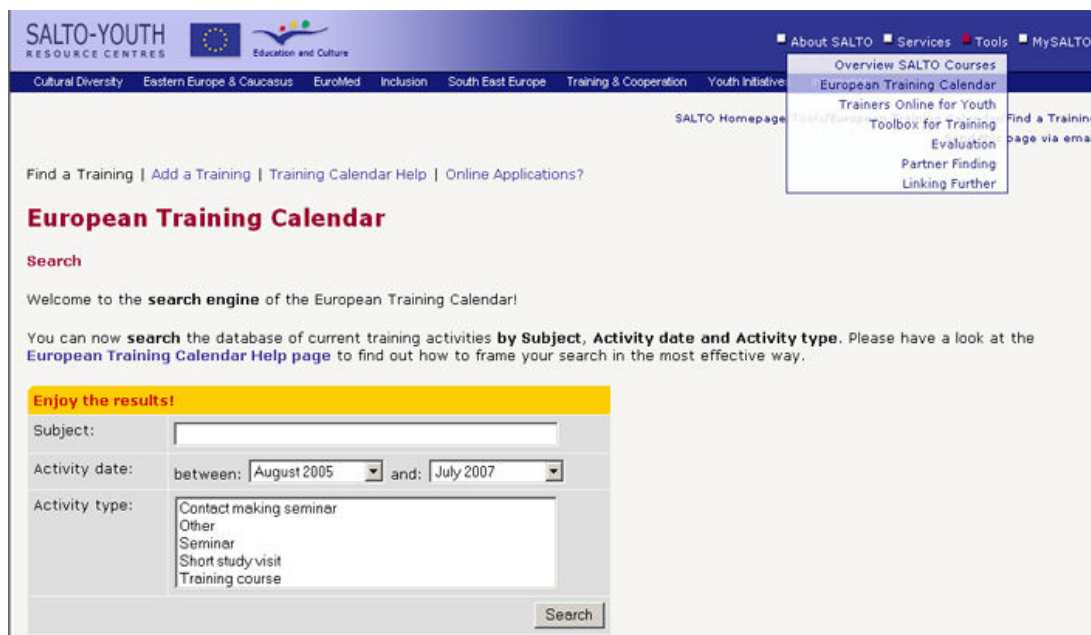
## 2.4. SALTO online to support valorisation and visibility of Innovative projects

As a part of this strategy, SALTO organises a meeting of approved "Innovative project" organisers and representatives of the YOUTH National Agencies (5-7 September 2005 in Bonn / Germany). The meeting aims to exchange good practise, to identify co-operation possibilities and synergy effects and to support the valorisation of the project results.

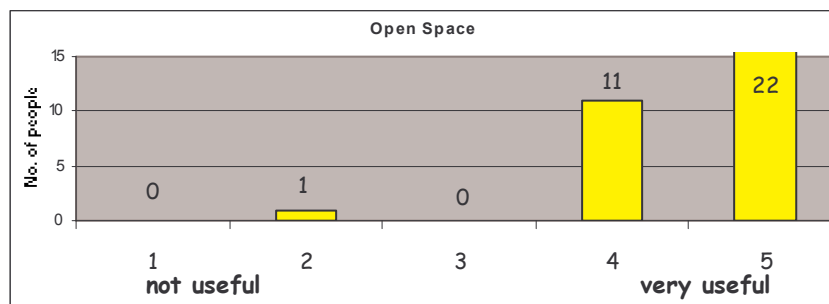

## 2.5. Open Space – “Co-operation and valorisation to support European youth work”

The Open Space method allowed to exchange ideas, tools, and activities available at high level: it served the need to identify common needs and find partners for future European activities.

97% (or 33 out of 34) of the participants evaluated the Open Space technology as useful. On a scale from 1=not useful to 5=very useful, 32% rated this method for exchange and development as useful and 67% felt it to be very useful.

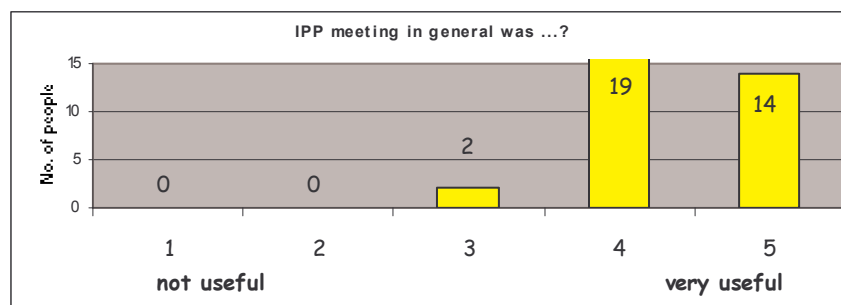

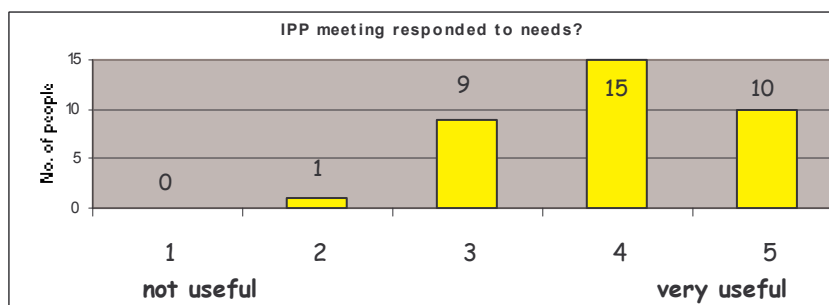
### 1. Your general evaluation of the usefulness of the "IPP meeting"

### 2. How far has the "IPP meeting" responded to your needs?



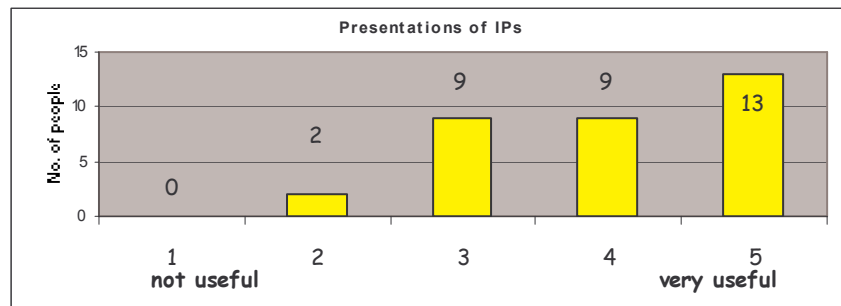
If your needs were not met, what should an IPP meeting focus on?

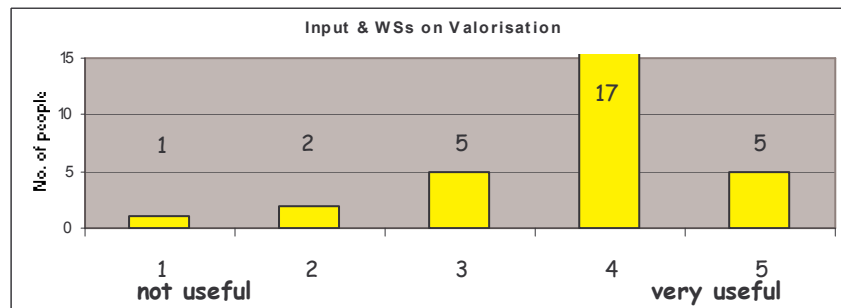

- Annoying that presentations clashed with WS on valorisation

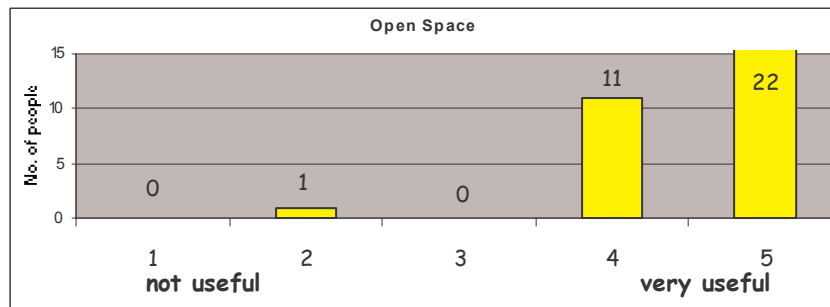
