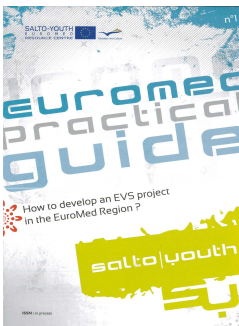
## Collection Practical guides (EN,FR,AR)

### Nº1 How to develop an EVS project in the EuroMed region?



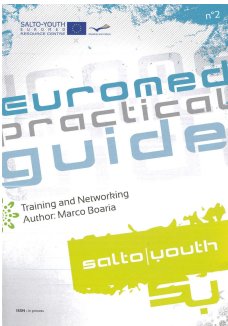
*This first Practical Guide is providing tips and tools about how to develop a good EVS in the EuroMed framework.*

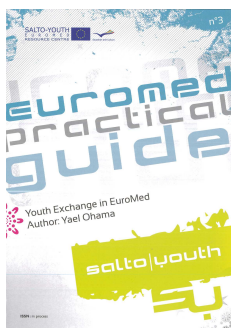
## N°2 Training and Networking

*This Practical Guide will lead the reader though the main steps of a Youth Exchange in EuroMed.*

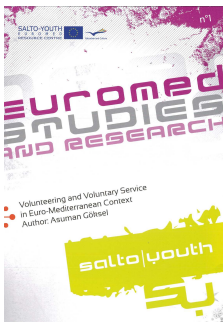


## Collection Studies and research (EN,FR, AR)

## N2 Supporting Learning: Long Term Training Course in EuroMed

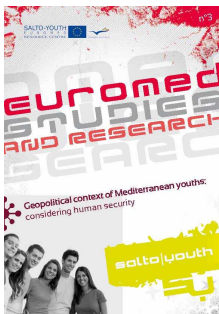

#### N4 EuroMed Youth and Sustainable Development

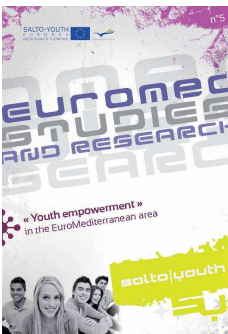


*This guide outlines threats to the Mediterranean environment and the pressing need to promote genuine sustainable development in the region.*

*And is it possible today to integrate certain teachings relating to these events in order to think out these “empowerment” policies?*

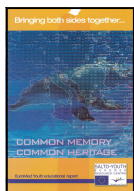


## Collection Bringing both sides together (EN) 11 issues

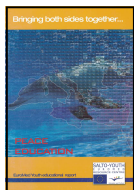

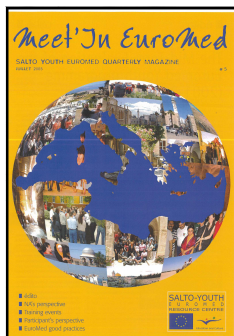
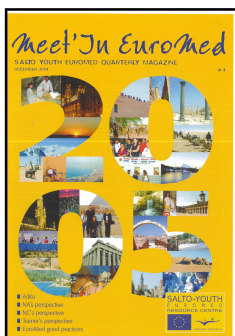
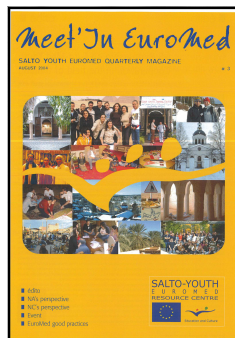
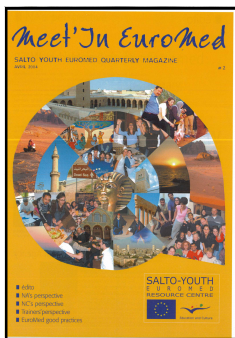
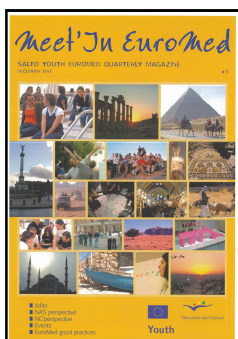


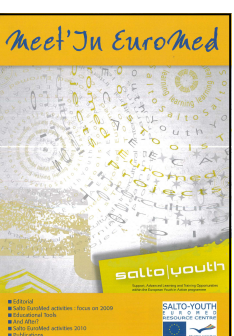
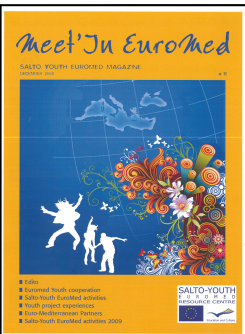
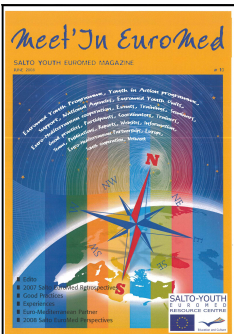
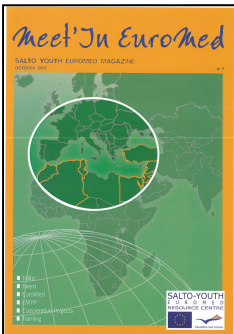
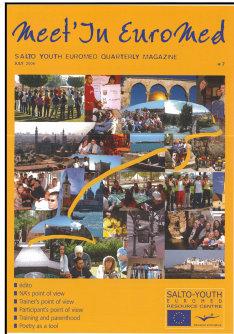
## Periodicals

## Studies on EuroMed Youth Policies in Mediterranean partner countries (2009)



The overall aim of the studies is to be a reference tool which would give all stakeholders in the field of youth, as well as youth project organisers, an overview of the situation of young people and of provisions available for them in the 10 partner countries.

The objectives were to identify whether there was a Youth Policy, legislation or any other national strategy addressing the needs of youth and what kind of provision was made through non-formal education and youth work in the relevant partner countries.

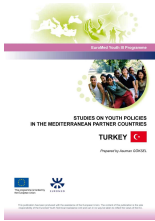
Research for the studies was carried out by 7 experts and involved gathering of information, during a 5-month period.

The outcomes of the studies, each produced in a report format following a common structure for all the ten studies, give an enlightening overview of the definition and situation of youth in the Mediterranean partner countries.

The studies focused on young people's rights and entitlements as active citizens, such as opportunities to vote, get elected and contribute to the decision-making process; the challenges faced by youth such as unemployment, immigration, housing, marriage, generational and cultural conflict, young women's place in society; young people's reactions in response to such challenges and description of provision for leisure-time activities and non-formal education through governmental and/or non-governmental youth institutions and organisations.



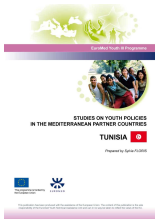
