Balkan Youth Exchange Report

In March 2015, Outward Bound Croatia organized a youth exchange which hosted 30 participants from following countries: Croatia, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Albania, Former Republic of Macedonia, United Kingdom and Slovakia.

OUTH EXCHANG

The need for this project originated from religious and national intolerance, lack of dialog and understanding between different religions across the Europe.

The participants were chosen by each partner organization - youth involved in the activities of the organizations, interested and motivated for the project, based on a motivational letter. Youth participants were aged between 18 and 30, and included fifteen

participants that are facing economic and social obstacles.

OUTH EXCHAING

Youth leaders were youth workers or facilitators in non-formal education active within their organizations, motivated to develop their competences about inter-religious dialogue and to share their experiences with other participants.

The main goal was further inclusion of minorities and focus on religious knowledge and dialogue, as was offering a dialogue for youth on topics which are belittled or overlooked in their current societies. All participants were expected to learn about identity formation in society and understanding the difference between national

and religious identity. We aimed to equip all participants with the know-how regarding inter-cultural dialogue, social and civic awareness.

OUTH EXCHAING

Additional activities were implemented to challenge stereotypes, conflicts and intolerance based on nationalities and minorities. Participants were expected to improve their knowledge of these subjects and to be able to deal with them in a more positive light, without challenging their beliefs and by working closely within EU values and Charter of Fundamental Rights. Competence of "learning to learn" was practised and improved, since the youth was equipped to deal with challenging obstacles and to be able to organize their own learning and its evaluation.

Participants were accommodated in hostel in Samobor, near the Croatia's capital, Zagreb. Participants were situated in a hostel near the city centre, where they did most of their activities and where from they explored the pittoresque city of Samobor.


OUTH EXCHANGE

Experienced youth leaders took the responsibilities of tutoring and supporting the participants.

The participants were provided with daily activities that handle each of the project goals. On the first day of arrival each participant received a welcome packet folder with writing utensils, a notebook for notes on sessions and small book for diary work.


Cultural identity was further encouraged during our daily activities. Ice breakers in the morning and afternoon were adjusted to promote language learning and risk prevention by expressing the need for a safe and understanding environment and a fun place to live, learn, and play.




"The people were am<mark>azi</mark>ng. Everyone cared for each other, respected and loved [others], which is the thing I appreciate!"


