The project "Frames of Happiness" is a 9 days training course realized in Moldova between 26th of August to 4th of September.

The aim of the project is to promote the young orphans' social inclusion and well-being, through tackling the issue of youth exclusion and discrimination.

At this project took part 32 youth workers from EU: Norway, Latvia, Romania, Spain, and EECA: Moldova, Ukraine, Georgia, Armenia interested to raise the awareness about the problem of the excluded children using the digital tools of photography and videography.

Our activities



The international team of 'Frames of Happiness' went to one of the moldovian youth centres, which helps orphans and children from poor families. Our main idea was to visit them and show our care by playing different games such as football, volleyball, name games, by chatting with them and also providing them with some material for school.





Country realities



People from child Protection Services take care about orphans very well
Orphans get everything what they need from government - financial help, free education, houses etc



There are 80 000 orphans in Ukraine
Orphans get financial help (270 EUR/month), free education and flat
Main problem: orphanages with children in occupied area - Donetsk and Luganska oblast'



There are 4 000 orphans in Moldova
Orphans get free education and university scholarship
Limited access to social life



Government provides basic help for children such as healthcare, education, etc.
After children get 18 years old, government provides other funding for further 6 years
Government does not provide enough social, psychological support for children



Government include kids in society through different programs (f.e. summer camps)
Orphans receive a salary until they are around 25 years old
Government provides less financial support than a few years ago



Government provides material resources.
Besides the Government's support many private initiatives are being taken to support children
There are no well-equipped rooms and good living conditions for orphans in Armenia

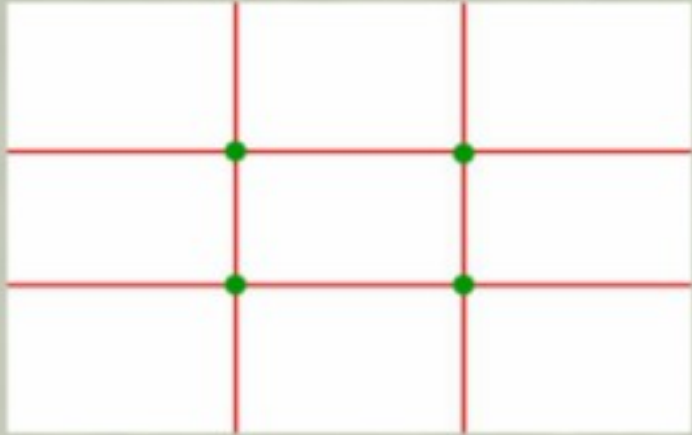


There are no big orphanages in the country. Now children live in small 'Family houses'.

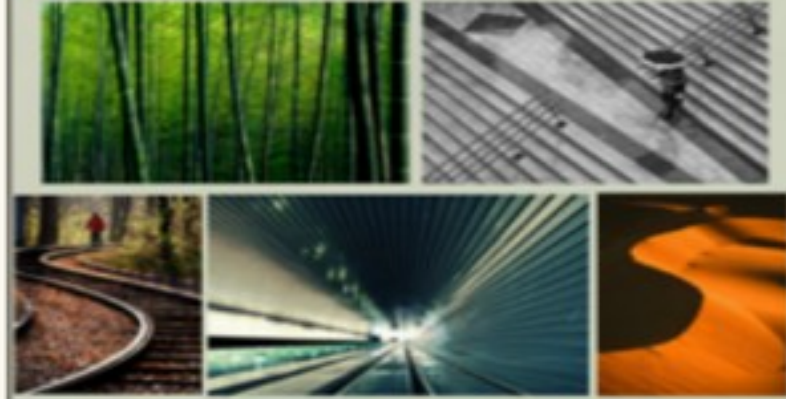
