

Obstacle One




Obstacle Two

 Funding which had been offered to you by the local municipality has been withdrawn.
You had planned to use this to part fund the project.

Obstacle Three

• The volunteer/a group member (who has been key in planning the exchange) receives a call from their mother. She has been diagnosed with cancer, and would prefer her daughter / son to be around for treatment. It will start in two weeks and last six months.



Obstacle Four

 The project activities have to change and will now focus around environmental activities instead of the sports activities which were planned. This is a significant change for your volunteer/group.



Obstacle Five

 The volunteer and their partner/two of the participants find out they are having a baby.



Obstacle Six

The responsible person in the Sending Organisation gets another job, someone will replace this post, but they know nothing about EVS or Youth Exchange.



Obstacle Seven

 A few days before departure, the volunteer/two participants gets into a fight after a drunken night out, causing a broken rib and suffering cuts & bruises them self.

Obstacle Eight

 The volunteer/ an exchange participant steels a car and crashes it.



Obstacle Nine

 Your group or volunteer should leave in one week, but the HO calls to say there is a problem with the accommodation and the project must be delayed for another three weeks.



Obstacle Ten

The volunteer or two group members' have been looking for a job on and off for some time and have now been offered a part-time temporary job.
