ABOUT OUR PROJECT

"Clean Air For Everyone" took place in Messina, Italy, at "Oasi Azzurra Village" from the 20th to 28th of May, 2023. The Youth Exchange successfully gathered youngsters 18-25yo from six programme countries: Italy, Spain, North Macedonia, Poland, Romania, and Turkey.



Each national team consisted of seven youngsters (1 Group Leader) for a total of 42 participants. Among them, 3 participants faced cultural, economic, and geographic barriers, reflecting our commitment to inclusivity and diversity.

They actively explored the main causes of air pollution and look into various measures to reduce it. The diversity of countries represented a valuable opportunity for exchanging knowledge and experiences related to air pollution.

OUR PROJECT'S MOTIVATIONS

Motivated by a desire to enhance our living environment, and public health, and raise awareness, the participants of the "Clean Air For Everyone" project organized this project with the primary objective of addressing air pollution.

The main reasons behind CAFE were exploring the causes of air pollution, brainstorming effective measures to reduce it, exchanging knowledge across Europe, promoting the Erasmus+ Programme, and fostering self-development and partnerships.



Another important goal of the project was to inspire and motivate communities to take action!

Participants worked towards this by creating high-impact awareness campaigns and engagement initiatives, culminating in the final "Breath Free" event.

They aimed to raise awareness about the issue and encourage people to adopt cleaner air practices and sustainable behaviours. By rallying collective action, their aim was to create positive change on a larger scale.

And guess what? We actually cleaned up the beach together, like superheroes fighting pollution. Talk about making a difference!







Won't you even try to protect my future?


Remember when we used to be clean and

of you,


I start smoking, naked, with the lights on.







My ancestors lived in tree bark,


on clean earth,

WHAT IS THE ERASMUST A CANADA AND A CANADA A

Erasmus+ is a European Union (EU) program that aims to support education, training, youth, and sport in Europe. It provides funding for individuals and organizations to participate in exchange and mobility activities within the EU and beyond.

Erasmus+ offers a range of opportunities, including study and work placements, traineeships, and volunteering projects. It also supports cooperation and innovation in the education and training sectors, as well as in youth and sport.

MOBILITY PROJECTS FOR YOUNG PEOPLE

Erasmus supports non-formal learning mobility of young people in the form of **Youth Exchanges**, with the objective to engage and empower young people to become active citizens, connect them to the European project as well as help them acquire and develop competencies for life and their professional future.

More specifically, Youth Exchanges aim to:

- foster intercultural dialogue and learning and feeling of being European;
- develop skills and attitudes of young people;
- strengthen European values and break down prejudices and stereotypes;
- raise awareness about socially relevant topics and thus stimulate engagement in society and active participation.

The Action is open to all young people, with a special focus on those with fewer opportunities.

YOUTH EXCHANGES

OVERVIEW

A youth exchange allows a group of young people from different countries to meet, live together and work on shared projects for a short period.

Youth exchanges take place outside the school environment.

On a youth exchange, you can expect to participate in activities such as workshops, exercises, debates, role-plays, outdoor activities and more. Participants' learning experiences are recognised through a Youthpass.

DURATION

Youth exchanges last between 5 and 21 days. This excludes travelling time.

CONDITIONS

Youth exchanges are open to people between the ages of 13 and 30 yo. To be a group leader in a youth exchange, you must be at least 18 yo.

FINANCIAL SUPPORT

The EU grant supports travel as well as practical and activity-related costs necessary for the exchange.
