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During the youth exchange in Lithuania young people had the change to dive into upcycling, nature and community garden. Besides those activities, participants were having debates, scavenger hunt, movie session, intercultural evenings, creating social campaigns and upcycling materials by creating bags and board games, cleaning up action, etc.

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Board games

Advices for creating eco-board games:

- 1. Think of the mechanics of the game (how it will look, what do you need to make it, how it will work, etc.)
- 2. Plot (what is the story behind it? What is the game about? (Our case ecology, but make it specific.). What's the name of the game?
- 3. Rules (how else others will know how to play it :P)
- 4. Playtesting (try it out after finishing, or better, let your friends do it)
- 5. Cannibalise old game (use games that you haven't played in years and it lays in the closet collecting dust, or maybe you have an old game where parts are missing, etc.)

6. Choose the tokens and/or cards of your game (use old objects, natural objects like stones - color it - or create something new from scraps).

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
