
















The new school year starts and there are a lot of new students, refugees that moved to an international school.



One of the new students named Mark is very passionate about sports. Before leaving his country he was about to join the youth national team in basketball.




During the lunch break he sees a group of boys playing basketball on the pitch. He walks towards them with a smile on his face.








At that time the teacher who was supervising the yard - Mr. Robert, observed the situation. He stayed quiet but had something in mind.

The students were divided into teams of two as they had 4 seconds to throw the ball and score in the basketball hoop by collaborating with each other.




Mark was grouped with the boy from the morning. His name was George.
