Description	Medieval civilization was a product of the fusion of institutions derived from Rome, from Christianity, and from the Germans. The psychology of the Middle Ages was derived from the Bible and the Teachings of the fathers, from Roman law, and from the Germanic mind. These three categories were fused together to form that composite government, society, soul, which we denominate as the "feudal age." Feudalism, in all its manifestations, prevailed over all central and western Europe from the ninth to the end of the thirteenth century. Out of that condition not only emerged the states and nations of modern Europe, but also their institutions, their religion, their social ideals, and practices, their psychology. It is an error to look upon the feudal age as one wholly of violence and decay. Regarded in its truest light, feudalism presented the phenomena of progress, not decline. This is a study of the genesis and development of one progressive idea which developed in and





	out of that period, and which has vital implications for society today if we have the eyes to see.
