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The two-year project “**Food Ethics**” has officially come to an end, marking not a conclusion but the beginning of a wider impact.

During the project, partners from Lithuania, Bulgaria, and Italy collaborated to develop innovative educational materials focused on **food ethics** — a concept that highlights the importance of ethical relationships across the entire food chain, from farmers and producers to restaurants and consumers.

The project aims to raise awareness about how trust, transparency, sustainability, and product traceability contribute to food quality and responsible consumption. By promoting local and traditional produce, the initiative supports short food supply chains, strengthens local economies, and encourages more sustainable production and consumption patterns.

To make the topic accessible and engaging, the partnership created two main learning tools:

- 🎓 **An online video course** featuring lectures from farmers, chefs, restaurant owners, historical cuisine experts, and psychologists, including a certificate of completion
- 🎴 **A card-based role-playing game** designed to stimulate reflection and discussion about ethical decisions in the food chain

Both resources are designed for vocational schools, youth groups, and anyone interested in exploring the topic in an interactive and practical way.
