These programmes especially address non-formal as well as informal learning, often focusing on intercultural competence and European citizenship as learning objectives.

Research findings and an exchange of practical experience have usually been presented and discussed with a specific focus on programme format, target group, or participating countries.

This European conference of researchers, practitioners, and involved institutions and organizations wants to take stock of current debates and research findings on educational youth mobility.
