Dear participants,

Hereby we are presenting you all the information on our common “4th International Youth Meeting: European Citizen – Where are you?”!

Following the 1st Youth Meeting (August 2010 in Heilbad Heiligenstadt, Germany), the 2nd Youth Meeting (May 2011 in Belgrade, Serbia) and the 3rd Youth Meeting (September 2011 in Riga, Latvia) the aim of the “4th International Youth Meeting: European Citizen – Where are you?” is to bring together experts from European level, trainers, leaders and youth workers to discuss the meaning of European Citizenship and youth participation, possible ways to break the issues down for the practice in international youth work and to come up with creative and innovative approaches, ideas and support for practitioners in the international youth field.

We will discuss the terms “Participation” and “European citizenship”, give a theoretical background and think about the question how is it in praxis? Establish connection between (youth) participation and core themes which we consider as crucial in European youth work when approaching the challenges of the 21st century as “discrimination, xenophobia & exclusion”; “fight against Youth Unemployment” and “Marketing, PR and the Web 2.0. for Youth NGOs”. The program gives the opportunity discuss practical examples as well as prevailing problems; suggest and communicate non-formal methods in order to use them in practice; show and diffuse good examples of European youth work (Quality & Experiences / Recognition of Non-Formal Education and Youth Work); critically discuss and creative thinking about European youth work and new ways of participation, to improve, document and promote youth projects in future (Networking, partnership building & future cooperation); share experiences with youth participation projects and discuss the issue of quality in order to improve it and to evaluate recent developments.

Europe needs active citizens and participation, because democratic societies are based on them. Therefore citizens must be encouraged and involved in participation for their own good. The idea of European Citizenship is based on the efforts of participation by the citizens themselves. The youth of Europe plays a crucial role in there. They are becoming decision-makers in the future. But before they need to know about themselves and their neighbours in Europe to evaluate, differentiate and solve problems that the future will bring. This project gives them the opportunity to get to know each other and try to listen and understand different point of views. The intercultural challenge that implies in here, 50 participants from EU27 programme countries and neighbouring partner countries from SEE and EECA will contribute in many ways to the individual learning process of each participant.

Based on our experiences made within the 1st, 2nd and 3rd Youth Meeting the present 4th Youth Meeting will offer a platform where all participants can learn in an atmosphere of mutual understanding something about themselves and something about their neighbours in Europe in general but in particular through exchanging their knowledge, experiences and best practice in the field of international youth work. To reach the aim to create a European awareness during the project therefore the participants will work together with methods of non-formal education about crucial points of youth participation in Europe. Another string that will guideline this project aims the questions what means European active citizenship and how can we support active participation in our home communities? Last but not least is to get connected and finding synergy-effects between us and new projects under the umbrella of YiA Programme of the European Commission.

Travel costs

We will reimburse **70% of the travel costs** for the YM on the basis of the **cheapest possibilities**, e.g. second class railway tickets, APEX-flights etc. by bank transfer after the YM and the receipt of **complete and original tickets, bills, receipts, boarding cards** etc. Arrival day is 21st of October 2012 (later arrivals are not possible). Official departure day is the 30th of October 2012 (earlier departure times are not possible). An emergency phone contact number is given in time by Email to future participants.

Please note!

1. Any costs for taxi are not eligible (exceptions possible after consultancy)!
2. In case persons arriving later than 21st of October 2012 or leaving before 30th of October 2012 any related costs (e.g. for booked hotel room) will be reduced from the travel cost reimbursement.
3. Following the guide lines of the YiA programme the travel must be realised by the participants on direct way within maximum 2 days. In case of longer stays or indirect travelling (holiday travel etc.) there is no reimbursement of travel costs! TRAVELLING AND TRANSPORT

From the airport:

From the airport (Prague International Airport) to the Centrum Mariapolis it is 27km. After the arrival at the airport you have to change money (1€ = 25 Czech crowns). For one ticket you have to pay 26 crowns.

Going by bus, metro and bus

Route: Take Bus No.100 from Airport to **Metro B 'Zlicin'** (intervals of 15 to 30 minutes, travel time **18 minutes**)

or Bus No.225 from Airport to **Metro B 'Stodulky'** (limited service, travel time **40 to 53 minutes**)

or Bus No.179 from Airport to **Metro B 'Nove Butovice'** (intervals of 12 to 30 minutes, travel time **45 minutes**)

Route: Then you have to go by metro on **line B** to Metro stop "**Vysočanská**" or to Metro stop "**Letňany**" on the **C line**. From "**Vysočanská**" you have to take the bus 375 or bus 259, 302, 375 or 378 from "**Letňany**" to final station "**Vinořský hřbitov**". On the opposite side of the bus stop you can see the Center.

Ticket price: 26 crowns (1,15€) + 13 crowns (0,60€) for luggage

Approximate travel time: 1 hour

From the main station:

Going by metro and bus:

From the central station (Hlavni nádrazi) you take the **C** metro line through the last station "**Letňany**". From there you continue with one of the following bus: 259, 302, 375, 378 till the station "Vinořský hřbitov" (the Center can be seen from the bus stop on the opposite side of the road).
