Volunteering and voluntary services in Europe

Creating more opportunities for cross-border volunteering for young people



Background

Crossing the border as a volunteer has a number of positive effects: increase of intercultural competence, self-efficacy, sense of social responsibility and entrepreneurship Organisations who are active in transnational networks, who host and/or send volunteers (from) abroad experience positive organisational development and strengthen the organisations' competences in diversity management and European citizenship. However, for volunteer organisations in several countries the possibilities

to send/host cross-border volunteers are limited. One of the accessible instruments European-wide is the European Voluntary Service (EVS). The focus of this partner finding seminar lays on possibilities beyond the EVS: What other national voluntary services are open for volunteers from other (European) countries, which funding instruments can be used to send or host a higher number of volunteers than provided by the limited budget of the EVS?

Aims

The seminar aims at:

- Offering a forum for cross-border volunteering projects and cooperations for the participating organisations and by this increase the numbers of placements and possibilities for cross-border volunteering
- Contributing to concrete agreements between partners about sending/hosting of volunteers
- Presenting the connection between the implementation of the EU Youth Strategy and the further opening of existing possibilities for cross-border volunteering

Target group

The contact making seminar is the follow-up of the international high-level seminar "Creating new opportunities for cross-border volunteering of young people" in September 2011 in Berlin. The seminar aims at the participation of volunteering organisations and projects which host and/or send young volunteers across the

border or which would like to start this. Countries with national volunteer services are in the focus as well as the countries which participated in the Berlin conference 2011 (Austria, Czech Republic, France, Germany, Italy, Poland, Russia, Spain, United Kingdom).
