



TOOL FAIR IV EDITION
Évora (Portugal)
From the 10th till the 15th of November 2009.























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Objectives of the event

The Tool Fair has became in a consolidated activity in the annual planning of training activities provided by SALTO EuroMed RC, in cooperation with the host National Agencies (2006, French NA; 2007 Turkish NA; 2008, Spanish NA; 2009, Portuguese NA; 2010, Italian NA; 2011, probably Estonian NA) and with the other SALTO Resources Centres.

The objectives are:

- o To gather and to valorise tools created and implemented within the framework of youth work in general and Youth in Action Programme more specifically.
- o To test tools.
- o To share and create a "common memory".
- o To go one step beyond in the visibility and the dissemination and exploitation of results.

A total of 151 persons were involved in this edition, from 34 countries, with representatives of 9 National Agencies (France, Turkey, Portugal, Estonia, Italy, Greece, Bulgaria, Lithuania, and Malta) and the SALTO Network (Inclusion, Cultural Diversity, Participation, Training & Cooperation, EECA). A total of 57 workshops were developed.

The activity has evolved from a showroom to a new concept of Tool Fair, where the youngsters played a main role through several activities:

- the Active Discovery of Évora reached its aim of teambuilding, creating a best atmosphere between participants since the very first moment
- the Photo Contest, with 452 pictures received, became in a strength for the TF4 visibility in the international framework. A selection of 27 photos were done and the TF4 participants voted the winner.
- the youth oriented format, opening some activities to the local youngster's participation (a total of 17 NGO'S local associations from Alentejo Region) supposed an added value to this visibility, in terms of local impact and knowledge of the Youth in Action Programme and the SALTO RC's
- the local partnership, supporting the activities in different levels (logistics, information, dissemination and publicity) became in other strength of this edition of the Tool Fair.
- The live stream edition through the website <u>www.toolfair4.org</u> supposes an innovation in the Tool Fair DEOR, covering the failure of the ELC.

Qualitative report from the Tool's Workshops

Here it is collected some quotes by some participants leading workshops during the Tool Fair:

The Workshop "David vs. Goliath "went fairly good even if in real life it needs more preparation. I like to thank one participant who helped me with the setting.

Due to the experience of most of the participants it was not necessary to play the whole game but only to simulate the spirit and the feeling of the healthy competition between youth workers and youngsters.

After the simulation we had some time to reflect upon the aims and the different types of games which were played. All participants appreciated the idea and the creativity of this non-formal method which promotes sportsmanship, fair-play, cooperation, democracy and teambuilding. I hope, I could give some good input to the participants in my workshop and I like to share this method with them.

I find the reflection time a very enjoyable and valuable moment and would even suggest bringing the duck-buddies to the next Toolfair in Italy. Now, here are my couple of feedback sentences on the Tooltime!

I have a feeling that I managed to achieve my objectives in regards to the tool sharing which I had in mind before coming to the Toolfair. I got the opportunity to spread a message and get some people interested to explore coaching as a tool, and approach or methodology in youth work. The time for the session was enough to run the giant board game "Motiv8". During the Toolfair I could test its new improvements since the previous time we did it during the Coach 2 Coach training course. I think it was possible to manage with both: to open the topic of coaching with fellow participants but also to collect their valuable feedback on how the game could be improved further. I got more confident with the tool and even inspired maybe to create it's "mini" pocket version.

The feedback that concerns more organisational side of experience I will include in the final evaluation later.
