Statistics of SALTO-YOUTH Activities in 2011

In 2011 SALTO Network in cooperation with National Agencies organized 124 educational events for youth workers, NAs and youth policy makers (114 in 2010). There were 94 activities:

- 28 regular EVS trainings in SEE region (33 in 2010)
- 16 regular EVS trainings in EECA region
- 15 activities to support the YiA and its structure (16 in 2010)
- 20 seminars, conferences, expert meetings and events (10 in 2010)
- 12 training courses (17 in 2010)
- 2 contact making and partnership building activities (3 in 2010)
- I study visits (2 in 2010)

In addition, 9 module trainings were held consisting of 30 separate activities (10 modules of 33 activities in 2010)

- 2 "Value the Difference"
- I "Get involved"
- I "Get in Network"
- 7 "BiTriMulti"
- 7 "Sending Organisation Hosting Organisation (SOHOs)"
- 3 "Appetisers"
- 5 "European Citizenship Training Course"

Countries where most SALTO activities were hosted were: France (14), Belgium (7), Georgia (7), Hungary (6), Turkey (6), Ukraine (6), UK (5), Russia (5), Macedonia (5), Portugal (4), Spain (4), Montenegro (4) and Poland (3).

In 2011 around 2180 participants took part in all above 124 SALTO activities. Over 2/3 of them were female and less than 1/3 male.


