Entrepreneurship goes social

KA1 Training for youth workers

14th – 23th November 2017 (including 2 days of travel)

Wisła, Poland

About the Training

The training for youth workers "Entrepreneurship goes social" will take place from 15th -22th November 2017 in Wisła, Poland. It will be attended by 24 participants from 12 countries: Bulgaria, Croatia, Greece, Spain, Lithuania, Macedonia, Malta, Germany, Poland, Romania, Slovenia, Hungary.

Promoting and developing entrepreneurship among young people is undoubtedly a very important issue nowadays. Unfortunately, many organizations active in the field of promotion of entrepreneurship do not include subjects related to Social Economy (SE) in the scope of their activities. This is a huge loss as inclusion of Social Economy in informal education devoted to promotion of entrepreneurship, could have very positive results. Why?

- This will allow the concept and definition of "traditional" entrepreneurship to be extended by social components, which are very often ignored in the 'traditional' meaning of entrepreneurship. It would enable young people to learn about SE as one of the opportunities for growth, employment and career path.
- SE can bring tremendous benefits especially in the field of work with young people with fewer opportunities - SE is based on creating opportunities and developing the potential of people and social groups that would most likely not have the chance to develop personally and professionally in conventional labor market conditions.
- Promoting SE allows to promote values that are important to society, such as tolerance and respect for diversity, "imperfections" of others (SE includes persons with disabilities); it raises awareness of other members of the community, promotes to care for the common good of the local communities etc.)

Inclusion of Social Economy in non-formal education will not only contribute for more effective integration of young people into the labor market (especially those with fewer opportunities), but also for changing attitudes of young people by communicating the specific values of Social Economy.

In order to make full use of the opportunities offered by the inclusion of aspects of SE in the promotion of entrepreneurship among young people, it is essential to develop knowledge and skills of youth workers.

Taking into account the above, the "Entrepreneurship goes social" training has the following objectives:

- To equip youth workers with knowledge about SE;
- To develop the participants' practical skills for the involving SE in their educational activities in the field of entrepreneurship;
- To jointly discuss and define how SE can be used to minimize the causes and effects of youth unemployment in the participants' local communities (especially in the context of young people with fewer opportunities);
- To raise participants' awareness of how non-formal education can influence and change attitudes of young people;
- To create a network of organizations and youth workers that interested in active use of the opportunities offered by the inclusion of SE in informal education about entrepreneurship;
- To develop ideas for future activities and project in this field.

Profile of the participants

The training will be attended by 24 participants from 12 countries: Bulgaria, Croatia, Greece, Spain, Lithuania, Macedonia, Malta, Germany, Poland, Romania, Slovenia, Hungary.

Requirements:

- aged 18+ (participants who do not meet this criteria In October 2017 cannot be accepted)
- youth workers
- experience and knowledge in the field of non-formal education in the field of promoting entrepreneurship among youth
- good knowledge of English
- high motivation to include elements of Social Economy in their non-formal activities,
- willingness to share knowledge and skills in their local environment.

Dates and schedule

Participants should arrive before 6 pm on 14th November. The departure will take place on 23 November 2017 after breakfast.

Please note that you cannot arrive later or leave earlier.

What are you required to do after the training?

The group from each country will be required to conduct a dissemination event for other youth workers / staff of the sending organization, in their city/town.

Please note that conducting this activity is obligatory. Report from the event (photos and description) should be sent to us before 14th January 2018.

Venue

The training will be held in Wisła, Poland.

Wisła is a beautiful town in southern Poland, close to the border with the Czech Republic and Slovakia.

Attractively situated at the source of the Wisla River, and surrounded by beautiful forests on nearby mountain slopes, Wisla is popular tourist destination. Known as the Pearl of the Beskid Mountains, it has breathtaking views and landmarks.

Participants will be accommodated in double and triple rooms with private bathroom, grouped by gender.

Costs

Accommodation costs (programme activities, food and accommodation) are covered by Erasmus+. There is no participation fee.

Travel

Travel costs will be covered, based on the country of participants, up to foreseen limits:

Bulgaria – 275 EUR

Croatia – 275 EUR

Germany – 180 EUR

Greece – 275 EUR

Hungary – 180 EUR

Lithuania – 275 EUR

Macedonia – 275 EUR

Malta – 275 EUR

Romania – 275 EUR

Slovenia – 275 EUR

Spain – 360 EUR

Poland – 0 EUR

If you spend more, we will not be able to reimburse you over the above mentioned limit.

Insurance

For participants from EU countries health insurance is not provided and will not be reimbursed by the organizers. **It is required for every participant from EU country to have the EKUZ card**, which provides a free insurance for EU participants on the entire territory of the European Union.

The exceptions are participants from Macedonia, which cannot obtain EKUZ. They should purchase a private insurance for the time of travel and the training. It will be reimbursed (up to 25 EUR per person) on the base of the invoice.
