


THEORGANIZATION


TRAINERS


PAOLO CURIALE

ABOUTRIMINI

Rimini is a lively city on the Adriatic coast of Italy, famous for its beautiful beaches, rich Roman history, and vibrant cultural life. It is the hometown of the legendary film director Federico Fellini and offers a mix of seaside relaxation, historical landmarks, and Italian hospitality. In November, Rimini is quieter than in summer, creating the perfect atmosphere to focus on learning while still enjoying walks by the sea.

TRAVEL

The closest airports are: Rimini, Bologna, Forlì, and Pisa.

It is also possible to fly to Milan or Rome and then continue by train.

Once you arrive in Italy, you need to get to Rimini. There are many train connections available – check schedules at <u>Trenitalia</u>.

From Rimini train station you have two options:

By bus (recommended): Take Bus No. 4 from the station exit and get off at "P.te Marecchia". From there, walk towards the bridge, follow the sidewalk along the river, and take the stairs immediately on the right. This will lead you down to the street under the bridge, where the hotel is located (less than 2 minutes on foot).

On foot: You can also walk from the train station, which takes about 25 minutes.

TRAVEL REIMBURSEMENT

Estimated reimbursement per participant (round trip):

- Italy → Rimini: €28 (standard) / €56 (green travel train, bus, carpooling)
- Romania, Bulgaria, Greece, Slovakia, Turkey, Portugal, Estonia → Rimini: most routes fall in the 500–1,999 km band (€309 / €417).
- Please check the official Erasmus+ distance calculator to confirm your exact amount.

Notes:

- Keep all tickets and boarding passes for reimbursement.
- Reimbursement is done after the training course, upon submission of travel documents and confirmation of participation.



- The training activities will take place at <u>SMARTY</u> Hotel, while accommodation will be provided at Hotel <u>Marselli</u>.
- Both hotels are just a few steps away from each other and from the seaside, offering a comfortable and convenient setting for the training course.
- Both venues are managed by MONDO REC, a local cooperative active in hospitality and social innovation. Their work focuses on creating welcoming environments that combine sustainable tourism, intercultural exchange, and community involvement.
