# ABOUT THE SEMINAR



**Hand in Hand** is an international seminar for Erasmus+ Youth accredited organisations and active organisations from programme countries that do not hold accreditation.

The seminar focuses on **practical cooperation** and **joint work** on youth mobility projects within the Erasmus+ Youth framework.

Participants will **share their experience**, **discuss challenges in partnerships**, and **exchange non-formal education methods** used in their everyday youth work.


The programme will also include a **study visit**, providing space for learning from local practice.

During the seminar, representatives of participating organisations will **lay the foundations for future joint activities** and cooperation in Erasmus+ Youth projects.

# OBJECTIVES & EXPECTED OUTCOMES

The seminar aims to support organisations in building **responsible, balanced, and long-term cooperation** within the Erasmus+ Youth Accreditation framework.

It focuses on **strengthening the quality of partnerships** and **promoting shared responsibility** in the planning and implementation of youth mobility projects.





# OBJECTIVES

- to strengthen cooperation between Erasmus+ Youth accredited organisations and active, non-accredited organisations from programme countries;
- to clarify roles, responsibilities, and expectations within accredited youth mobility projects;
- to reflect on challenges related to partnership cooperation under the Erasmus+ Youth Accreditation framework;
- to exchange good practices and working models between organisations with different levels of experience;
- to encourage a culture of shared responsibility and mutual trust in international partnerships.

# Expected Outcomes

- participants gain a clearer understanding of quality standards in Erasmus+ Youth projects;
- participants develop more realistic and balanced approaches to partnership cooperation;
- increased readiness of non-accredited organisations to take responsibility for joint activities and project implementation;
- strengthened communication and trust between partner organisations;
- concrete ideas for future cooperation aligned with the principles of Erasmus+ Youth Accreditation.



# Participant Profile



This seminar is designed for **participants who are actively involved** in Erasmus+ Youth cooperation and are interested in developing responsible, long-term partnerships.

## Who can apply:

Representatives of **Erasmus+ Youth accredited organisations** involved in the planning and implementation of youth mobility projects;

Representatives of **active organisations from Programme Countries** that do not hold Erasmus+ Youth accreditation but cooperate, or plan to cooperate, within accredited projects and implement their own projects.

Participants with **practical experience** in international youth work or project implementation;

Participants who are **motivated to actively contribute to discussions, group work, and peer learning.**

Readiness to share experiences, challenges, and working practices openly;

Willingness to reflect on partnership quality, roles, and responsibilities;

Active participation throughout the entire seminar programme;

Openness to cooperation with organisations with different levels of Experience;

Commitment to applying the seminar outcomes in future Erasmus+ Youth Cooperation.

# Working Methods & Learning Approach

The seminar is based on non-formal education methods and peer learning, with a strong focus on reflection, dialogue, and practical exchange between participants.

## **WORKING METHODS:**

During the seminar, participants will work using a variety of interactive methods, including:

- facilitated group discussions and guided reflection sessions;
- small-group and plenary work focused on concrete partnership situations;
- peer learning activities based on participants' real experiences;
- structured exchanges of practices and working models used in Erasmus+ Youth projects;
- collaborative exercises supporting mutual understanding and trust.



# Working Methods & Learning Approach

## LEARNING APPROACH:

The learning process is participant-centred and experience-based. The seminar builds on the knowledge, experience, and perspectives brought by the participants themselves. Facilitators support the learning process by creating a safe and inclusive space, guiding discussions, and ensuring that different voices and levels of experience are respected.

## SPECIAL ATTENTION IS GIVEN TO:

- inclusiveness and equal participation;
- creating a respectful and safe learning environment;
- adapting methods to different learning styles and comfort levels;
- supporting meaningful dialogue between accredited and non-accredited organisations.

## DESCRIPTION OF THE PLACE:


The youth centre in Motycz Leśny has been hosting organisations implementing international youth projects for over 25 years and is very well adapted for the implementation of such activities. The centre offers **11 shared rooms with private bathrooms** for participants, a well-equipped conference room, and outdoor green areas, including a sports field, a barbecue area, and a nearby forest. Participants will be accommodated in **shared rooms for 2–3 people**.

## COSTS:

Participants' accommodation is covered by the Erasmus+ programme.

# Reimbursement of the travel costs

Travel costs will be reimbursed upon submission of **original travel documents** and **proof of payment**, in line with Erasmus+ grant rules.


For distances between **10 and 99 km**, the reimbursement is **28 EUR** for standard travel and **56 EUR** for green travel.

For distances between **100 and 499 km**, the reimbursement is **211 EUR** for standard travel and **285 EUR** for green travel.

For distances between **500 and 1,999 km**, the reimbursement is **309 EUR** for standard travel and **417 EUR** for green travel.

For distances between **2,000 and 2,999 km**, the reimbursement is **395 EUR** for standard travel and **535 EUR** for green travel.

For distances between **3,000 and 3,999 km**, the reimbursement is **580 EUR** for standard travel and **785 EUR** for green travel.
