






CONTENT

The activity is designed as a Partnership Building Activity for organisations working with young people aged 14–16 who are interested in developing meaningful and realistic Erasmus+ youth exchanges for this specific age group.

The main focus of the activity is to support organisations in finding suitable partners who work with a similar age group and in similar contexts, such as rural or socially disadvantaged areas. Through structured networking and joint reflection, participants will gain a deeper understanding of each other's target groups, youth work realities and organisational approaches.

A key part of the programme is the exchange of non-formal education methods and practical approaches to working with early teens. Participants will jointly explore how to introduce European and Erasmus+ topics to young people aged 14–16 in an age-appropriate, engaging and meaningful way, taking into account their developmental stage, motivation and needs.

The activity will also support participants in developing initial ideas for future youth exchanges and partnerships, based on a good match of target groups, values and working methods. The aim is to create a solid foundation for long-term cooperation that is realistic, safe and relevant for early teen participants.

FOR WHOM THE TRAINING IS INTENDED:

The activity is intended for organisations working with young people aged 14–16 who are interested in developing Erasmus+ youth exchanges for this specific age group.

It is particularly relevant for youth workers, project coordinators and organisational representatives who already work with early teens and want to find partners with a similar target group, values and approaches.



Distance calculator







ACCOMMODATION OVERVIEW

HOSTING ORGANISATIONS:

LOCAL ACTION GROUP SAINT JOHN OF NEPOMUK

The Local Action Group Saint John of Nepomuk is an organisation with long-term experience in youth work and non-formal education, particularly with young people aged 14–16 in rural and socially disadvantaged areas.

The organisation is accredited in the Erasmus+ Youth programme and regularly implements youth exchanges and international mobility projects for young people and youth workers. Through its activities, dozens of participants gain international experience every year.

LAG SJN provides practical learning opportunities through open youth clubs and an English club, focusing on inclusion, motivation and age-appropriate methods for working with early teens. It is also active in the European Solidarity Corps, offering young people opportunities to engage in meaningful community-based projects. In its broader role, LAG SJN brings together municipalities, NGOs, businesses and local citizens to support education, community development and international cooperation aimed at improving the quality of life in the region.
