AIMS

With this project we aim to empower youth workers with the skill set necessary to navigate the complexities of their work, while also thriving within it. The heart of this project is to introduce youth workers to the **concept of assertiveness**.

By learning to express themselves clearly and respectfully, we aim to improve youth workers abilities to create spaces that are inclusive, respectful, and empowering for the young people and communities they work with.

At its core, this project focuses on **strengthening youth workers assertiveness**. The project explores how youth workers can communicate clearly, set healthy boundaries, manage conflicts constructively, and provide meaningful feedback while maintaining empathy and mutual respect.

With this project we aim to enhance the competencies of youth workers in **assertive communication, conflict management, and feedback delivery**.

By integrating assertiveness into professional practices, youth workers not only enhance their communication skills but also **contribute to their own well-being and resilience**.

WHAT TO EXPECT

ENHANCING ASSERTIVE COMMUNICATION SKILLS

Learning to express your thoughts, emotions, and boundaries clearly and confidently, while respecting others.

UNDERSTANDING THE ASSERTIVE APPROACH

Learning to differentiate passive and aggressive communication styles.

ADVANCE FEEDBACK SKILLS

Mastering the ability to give and receive constructive feedback that empowers growth.

HANDLE CONFLICT EFFECTIVELY

Exploring various conflict resolution methods and practice using assertiveness as a way to navigate conflicts constructively.

METHODOLOGY

The training is based on non-formal education and experiential learning principles. You will be actively involved in the holistic learning approach adapted to your needs and motivation.

The training will be divided into **two parts**.

In the first part, participants will gain knowledge and skills.

In the second part, they'll have the opportunity to apply what they've learned. This practical experience will focus on teamwork that is participatory and inclusive.

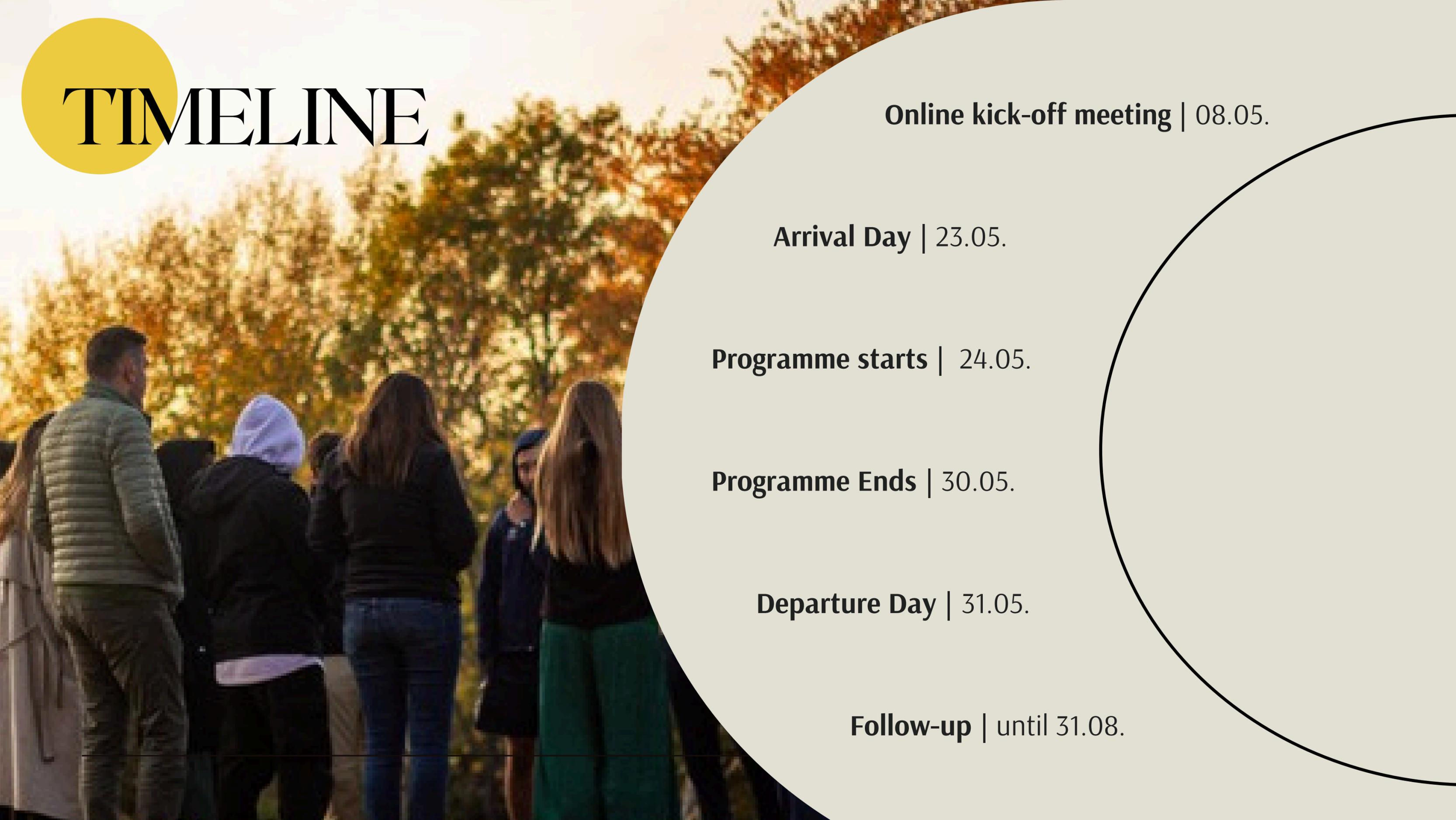

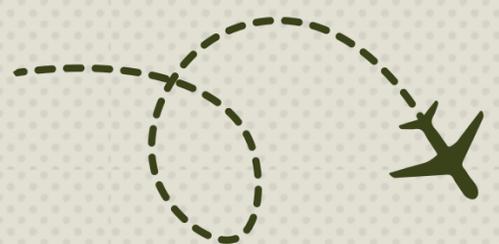
TRAVEL & REIMBURSEMENT

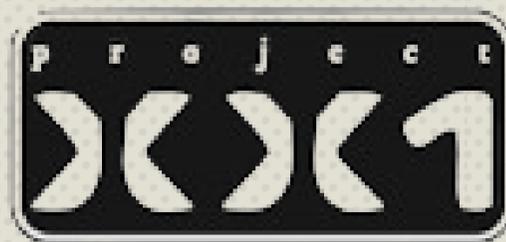
