Background and Rationale

In recent years, the Human Rights Education community has been operating in an increasingly complex and contradictory environment. Global geopolitical developments are not only making the promotion of human rights more difficult, but in many cases actively undermining them.


Human rights violations affect multiple contexts, including those in which citizens traditionally consider their rights to be guaranteed and inviolable. This reality exposes a growing disconnection from shared human rights values, as well as a widening gap between political declarations and actual practices, particularly at the level of international and national institutions.

Objectives of the Conference:

The conference aims to offer a space for the HRE community to reflect on their role and to explore how Human Rights Education can be adapted in times of systemic human rights violations. This process contributes to reconnecting with shared human rights values, transforming them from abstract principles into authentic and collective practices for Social Justice.

The specific objective are:

- to provide a space where critically reflect about the HRE practice in this historical moment;
- to facilitate the exchange of strategies, tools and support mechanisms among practitioners;
- co create a shared position of the HRE community on the conditions in which it operates today.



Approach and Methodology:


The conference will be designed as a participatory learning space by using non formal education principals, combining plenary discussions, contributions from external experts and collaborative working sessions.

The participants will be hosted in a shared rooms of **3 to 4 people**, each room having a bathroom inside.


The hostel provides towels and sheets, **but not shampoo and shower gel**, so it's better that you bring with you - or buying from here .

How to reach the Open011 from airport?

DOUBLE CLICK TO ACCESS THE HOTEL'S LOCATION



📍 **BERGAMO ORIO AL SERIO AIRPORT (BGY):**

Shuttle to Milano Centrale station, then train to Torino Porta Nuova station and then bus;

📍 **LINATE AIRPORT (LIN):**

Shuttle to Milano Centrale station, then train to Porta Nuova or Porta Susa station, and then bus;

📍 **MALPENSA AIRPORT (MXP):**

Shuttle to Torino Porta Susa station, then bus;

📍 **TURIN CASELLE airport (TRN):**

Shuttle to Turin Porta Nuova or Turin Porta Susa, then bus;

Train every 30 minutes to Turin Porta Susa station then bus.

📍 **TURIN PORTA NUOVA STATION:**

Bus 11 or bus 52 - get off at Chiesa della Salute


📍 **TURIN PORTA SUSA STATION:**

Bus 10 or bus 46 - get off at Chiesa della Salute
