The venue

Budapest, Hungary, located on the banks of the Danube River in Central Europe, is a popular tourist destination known for its stunning imperial architecture and vibrant atmosphere. This capital city offers a mix of modern amenities and historic Hungarian charm, making it ideal for both relaxation and exploration. Visitors can enjoy world-famous thermal baths, explore local shops and restaurants, and experience a unique nightlife. Additionally, Budapest serves as a convenient base for excursions to nearby historical sites and natural attractions, such as the Danube Bend and the historic town of Szentendre.

The exact address of the activity location will be shared only to the accepted applicants.





Travel & reimbursement

This activity (accommodation, food, travel) is supported by the Inclusive Evolution: The Next Generation 2026 project, co-funded by the Erasmus+ Programme.

- Travel reimbursement will be made to **the sending organization's bank account** after receiving:
 - Boarding passes (all legs of the trip)
 - Travel invoices or e-tickets
- Reimbursements will follow Erasmus+ distance band regulations according to the 2026 guide.
- We will reimburse the travel based on real costs not exceeding the lump sums based on the Erasmus+ travel distance bands up to:
 - **10 – 99 km: standard travel 28 EUR, green travel 56 EUR**
 - **100 – 499 km: standard travel 211 EUR, green travel 285 EUR**
 - **500 – 1999 km: standard travel 309 EUR, green travel 417 EUR**
 - **2000 – 2999 km: standard travel 395 EUR, green travel 535 EUR**

Travel costs will be reimbursed based on the most economical, eco-friendly, and efficient options:

- Eligible options include low-cost flights, 2nd class train tickets, buses, minivans, and carpooling.
- Travel costs also cover public transportation (taxis are NOT eligible unless there are no public transport options available).
