Youthpass in Action

Impact, practice and future

June 24-25, 2013 in Brussels, Belgium

Youthpass, the recognition tool and strategy of the EU Youth in Action programme was launched in July 2007. Almost six years later, the European Commission publishes the results of the Youthpass Impact Study. A considerable amount of experience has been made across Europe on putting Youthpass into practice, on implementing it as a tool to reflect on learning within the Youth in Action projects, and on using it for further pathways.

At the same time, the approaching new EU programme generation (2014-2020) means new perspectives and frameworks for Youthpass. Furthermore, the recently adopted Council Recommendation on the validation of non-formal and informal learning (2012), inviting Member States to establish a national system of validation of non-formal and informal learning outcomes, proposes as one of the guiding principles that the use of Union transparency tools, among them Youthpass, should be promoted. Vivid discussions are being held at various levels about the future of education and learning, about the challenges that young people face, about the need for a better recognition of non-formal and informal learning, and the role and development of non-formal learning in the youth field.

'Youthpass in Action' is an opportunity to discuss the following questions:

What is the impact of Youthpass, considering its different roles (tool, process, strategy), on young people, youth workers, youth work?

What are the lessons to be learned from the experiences so far?

What is the future framework for the recognition tool, in the light of more general educational trends?

What are the needs and opportunities for the development of Youthpass?

'Youthpass in Action' is an event for national and European policy makers, youth workers and youth leaders, trainers in the youth field, National Agencies, and other experts who are interested in and wish to contribute to the future of Youthpass.
