Description of the training course

Which are the challenges a trainer, teacher, educator faces today? How can you motivate the learners? Can the combination of formal and non-formal education involve the learners into the lifelong learning process? Competence based approach, self-assessment and learning portfolios; how can you use them for your group of learners?





Aim

The issue of the competence-based approach is very important in Europe's labor market today. Skills being acquired through non-formal learning methodology are very much appreciated in almost all sections of personal and professional development. Many research has been done which shows that individuals who are having additional, to their formal educational background, skills and competences are having more opportunities in finding a well paid job and continue their lifelong learning path.

This training course aims to offer clear learning results in terms of using non-formal learning methodology and easy-to-use tools at the field of the competence based approach.

More specifically, the main objectives of the training course are:

- To train teachers, educators, youth workers and trainers on the competence-based approach.
- To share non-formal learning methodology tools and experiences
- To increase awareness in the use of the 8 key competences and self-assessment.
- To offer the opportunity to the participants to create their own tools and learn how they can adjust the already existing tools in their daily work.
- To increase their ability in managing non-formal learning workshops and sessions.
- To acquire competences in motivating their trainees/learners/students, actively involve them in the learning process and develop the appropriate evaluation methodology.

The objectives of this training course are meeting the objectives of the Lifelong Learning Programme as "FORMAL EDUCATION MEETS NON FORMAL LEARNING, the competence based approach" is expected to increase the accessibility of learning opportunities for adults, to develop innovative adult education practices and increase the participation of educators, teachers, youth workers and trainers in lifelong learning as learners.





Methodology

During the training course we will follow non-formal learning methodology adjusted to the needs of the participants.

More specifically, we will use:

- Workshops
- Group Sessions
- Peer education
- Simulations
- Discussions
- Tool's practice in cooperation with local schools

The trainers will also give an input in non-formal learning process and they will make presentations of projects, which are combining formal and non-formal techniques. Some sessions will be dedicated to the competence-based approach the link with the labor market and the e-portfolio.

Presentation on competence-based certificates will take place and the participants will receive reading material on how to develop competence-based self-assessment methodology in schools, youth work and other educational institutions.

Methodology will mix theoretical and practical learning sessions. Working methods will be interactive and participants' active involvement will be stimulated by trainers throughout the course. Questions, groups and individual works, sharing and brainstorming activities will be used to reassure a better concepts' understanding and assimilation.

The deadline is 30th of April 2013!

Step 3.

Send us your confirmation document from your National Agency

Your National Agency will inform you regarding the approval of your application and the award of your grant. After receiving the final decision of your National Agency, please inform us immediately.

You can apply only for one training course per year.

General Information

Who can participate to the Grundtvig Programme

Staff working on a part-time or full-time basis, which may include volunteer staff, in any sector of adult education, formal, non-formal or informal, including:

- Teachers/trainers in adult education, and the trainers of such teachers/trainers
- Heads and managerial staff of organizations providing adult learning opportunities
- Staff involved in intercultural adult education, or working with migrant workers and travelers
- Staff working with adults with special educational needs
- Staff working with adults at social risk, for example mediators and street educators
- Counselors or career advisors
- The inspectorate
- Other education staff at the discretion of national authorities

Eligible Countries

Applicants must be located in a country participating in the LLP1. In 2013 the following countries are eligible:

- 27 EU Member States
- Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway
- Turkey and Croatia
- Switzerland

General Information about the Grundtvig Programme

The Grundtvig programme focuses on the teaching and study needs of those in adult education and alternative education streams, as well as the institutions and organizations delivering these services. Supporting lifelong learning and mobility in this way also tackles Europe's ageing population problem.

Launched in 2000 and now part of the overarching Lifelong Learning Programme, Grundtvig aims to provide adults with ways to improve their knowledge and skills, keeping them mentally fit and potentially more employable. Not only does it cover learners in adult education, but also the teachers, trainers, education staff and facilities that provide these services. These include relevant associations, counseling organizations, information services, policy-making bodies and others involved in lifelong learning and adult education at local, regional and national levels, such as NGOs, enterprises, voluntary groups and research centers.





There are also actions supporting adult learner mobility, such as exchanges and, now in the 2007-2013 programme, so-called 'European Assistantships'.

Objectives and actions

Specific aims are to:


- Increase the number of people in adult education to 25 000 by 2013, and improve the quality of their experience, whether at home or abroad
- Improve conditions for mobility so that at least 7 000 people per year by 2013 can benefit from adult education abroad
- Improve the quality and amount of co-operation between adult education organizations
- Develop innovative adult education and management practices, and encourage widespread application
- Ensure that people on the margins of society have access to adult education, especially older people and those who left education without basic qualifications
- Support innovative ICT-based educational content, services and practices Actions include support for:
- Mobility, including visits, placements, 'assistantships', adult education exchanges (i.e. staff training and professional development) and the preparations needed to plan the exchanges
