Summary

A KIND OF MAGIC is a long-term project (Erasmus+ Mobility of Youth Workers). Its aim is to develop competences and expertise of youth workers and youth leaders working with young people from diverse minorities and young people with fewer opportunities, and through that create better conditions and empowerment for them.

Methodology

The project is based on non-formal education, experiential learning, participants' centered approach, blended learning: a combination of residential training courses and an online phase. Due to the long-term nature of the course, participants will be able to experience a range of methods, techniques and activities of non-formal education, such as Open Space Technology, Appreciative Inquiry, coaching, World Café, and develop some by themselves.







How will it look like?

A KIND OF MAGIC consists of 2 residential training courses and practice and coaching phase between.

First training course: **9.-16.February 2018** in the Czech Republic, in the beautiful ecological centre Slunakov (<u>www.slunakov.cz/en</u>), near Olomouc. Its aim will be to establish the framework of the project, create working groups, give learning inputs, develop & explore the talents and competences of the youthworkers.

Practice phase: March - April 2018: participants will put their skills into action by organising local level events, involving the young people in their communities. Support and coaching will be offered in this phase by all 4 members of the team in the form of online coaching and feedback.

Second meeting: 21.-27.May 2018 in Italy, Sermugnano (Viterbo). This meeting will be based largely on contributions from the participants – sharing the results from the practice phase, or other learning points they will offer to the group. We will provide inputs on how to implement the learning, focus on the evaluation of the practice phase and on planning future steps.

We want to support youth workers and young people in their communities, so that more people can discover THEIR magic!

We see diversity not as a challenge, but as a source of inspiration!

Our definition of **"MAGIC"**: the art of creating special, valued experiences and relationships with and for young people celebrating in all their forms uniqueness, talent and diversity.





What are the project objectives?

• Inspire youth workers / youth leaders working with young people from marginalised groups **to promote diversity**;

• Examine effective **strategies for challenging stereotypes** and stigmatisation associated with marginalised groups;

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• **Establish partnerships** between participants and organisations working with diversity and **exchange good practices;**

• Discover different possibilities for **inclusive youth work** within the **framework of Erasmus+;**

• **Explore the understanding of "MAGIC"** with youth workers, identify how this is realised and can be used in their work with young people;

• **Provide tools and methods** for youth workers for recognising talents and abilities that create the genuine magic within individuals;

• Experience peer and facilitated **support while implementing local initiatives** and actions;

• Discover and explore **approaches of empowering young people** to share their unique talents and abilities within their communities;

Costs and Travel Reimbursement

Eligible travel costs for course in Italy: Italy: $20 \in$, Spain: $360 \in$

Czech R., Greece, Hungary, Slovakia, UK: 275 €

Please note that you will only be reimbursed if you **choose the most reasonable way of travelling** (no first class or taxi for example). The reimbursement of the travel costs will be after the completion of the whole project.
