Dear Partners,

We are delighted to introduce you: **conVERSations – Slam Poetry for Youth Inclusion**, a project created out of our common interest for **innovative methods** to be used in youth work.

Who are we?

Education Studio is an organization from Cluj-Napoca, Romania, gathering a team of young people dedicated to self-development, youth empowerment and nonformal education.

Innovative Methodologies

Education Studio focuses on adapting from different fields, tools that we see effective for youth development. And the star of this project is... **Slam Poetry!**

What is it?

Slam Poetry is a form of spokenword art. Spokenword involves performance-based poetry that focuses on the genuine approach of the author on different life events and dillemas.

The art of spokenword has existed for many millenia. The tradition of the spokenword is particular to cultures around the world when oral traditions were the means to pass on the knowledge to the future generations: ancient Greeks, African communities, American black neighbourhood etc.

Our approach in nonformal education

We use Slam Poetry as a development method to give young people a voice, and to empower them to believe that their vision about life is valuable, necessary and significant for their community. We use it to develop critical thinking about the world they are living in and about their own existence.

Trainers Maria Cărbunaru



Maria is a Romanian trainer passionate of nonformal methods that unlock the expressive capacity of people and bring at the surface their creative potential and life stories.

In 2014 she founded an Improvisational Theatre School in Cluj-Napoca, where the techniques of Improv are used for self-development and empowerment of young people.

Maria uses slam poetry as a tool of self-study, but also as a method to give a voice to young people to share their stories, that otherwise might remain unspoken.

Bas Boettcher

Bas Böttcher is one of the co-founders of the German slam poetry scene. His texts are regarded as classics of the contemporary stage lyric.

Bas Böttcher taught at the German Insitut of literature in Leipzig, at the Goethe Institute and at the University of the Arts in Berlin, where he acquired his training skills. He uses nonformal education methods to teach slam poetry for any type of persons interested.



He worked with persons of different age (children, youth, adults etc.) in supporting them finding their voice and interacting with each other in an open way, through poetry.

Training dates:

Departure day: 29th of April 2018

- ✓ understand the educational use of slam poetry in youthwork
- ✓ create a learning experience based on slam poetry, back in their country, for the community they work with.

We aim that the future participants will be people active in the field of education and youthwork.

They can be members or collaborators of the partner organizations, or independent social workers, like: **youthworkers** involved or planning to involve in projects with marginalised youth, **social workers**, **educators**, **community facilitators**, **cultural workers that use art for social causes**.

The relevant profile of the participants for this project is focused on different criteria.

Even so, if you like to write from time to time, if you do journaling, if you like poetry or arts in general, this might support you on the way.

- ✓ prove their need of a method that tackles the social inclusion issue;
- ✓ have access/are already working with a group of marginalized youth;
- ✓ commit to create a learning experience based on Slam Poetry method for young people, after the training course;
- ✓ are willing to develop themselves personally and professionally;
- ✓ want to try new approaches and methods;
- ✓ want to develop their creativity, open-mindedness and work in an intercultural learning environment.

Financial conditions

Travel reimbursement & Insurances.

All food and accomodation is funded from Erasmus+ grant. Travel costs will be reimbursed after the training, when we receive all travelling bills including boarding passes.

According to the Erasmus+ financial rules we will be able to reimburse a specific amount of money for each country, which is described in the table below.

For some participants, depending on the destination and means of transportation, we can reimburse the full amount of travel costs. For other participants we can reimburse only in the limit of the specific amount of money. Please pay attention to the figures and conditions.

Insurance

We are strongly recommending you to have insurance while you are in Romania. Each participant will be in charge of purchasing one, because no private insurance will be reimbursed.

Very important: your tickets have to be given to the organizers during the project. Therefore, please keep any ticket, invoice, receipt and boarding pass during the travel in order to be reimbursed.

If you want to come to Romania earlier/stay longer (for sightseeing etc.), the tickets that we can reimburse can be **max. 2 days before and/or after** the training course starts.

Where

The Training Course will take place at a venue in a village close to Cluj-Napoca area. We will come back with details about the location, prior to the event.

Venue

The training will take place in Măguri – Răcătău, a beautiful in the mountains, 45 km far away from Cluj-Napoca, in a charming nature atmosphere, at Pensiunea Valea Paradisului (The Paradise Valley Pension).
