# Overview

Recent events in our Euro-Mediterranean communities have led the Association of Human Rights Educators and its partner organisations to analyse what role youth work could play to prevent violent extremism especially affecting young people.

Despite the complexity of dealing with violent extremism, the project wants to contribute to address some root causes from the perspective of youth work instead of focusing on securitarian and counter-radicalisation policies.

Through examples and practical tools 25 educators, youth workers and youth leaders from the Euro-Mediterranean area will develop youth work competences to identify violent extremism root causes and address them through youth work techniques.



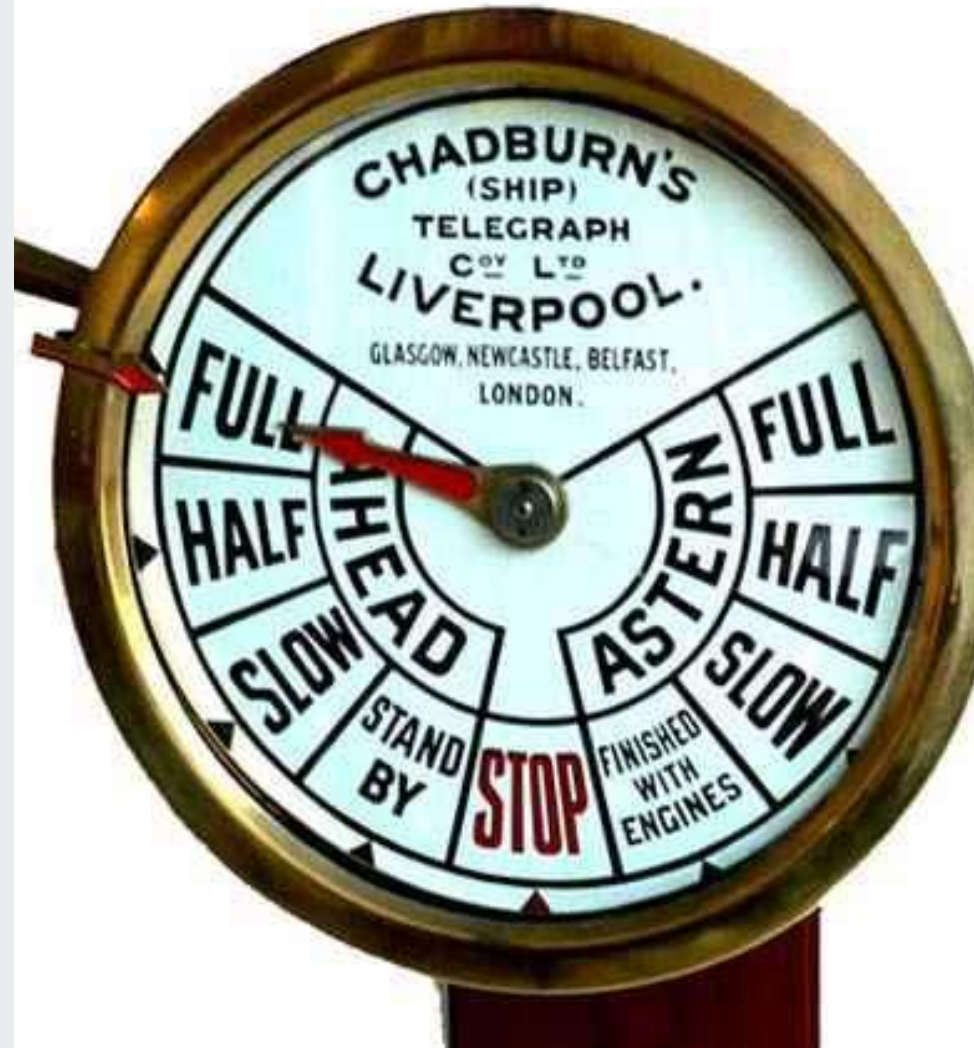

# Participant's profile

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The course is designed for educators, youth workers and youth leaders from Tunisia, Estonia, Latvia, Turkey, Jordan, Lebanon, and Italy, with youth work experience and capacity to act as direct multipliers in their communities.

Participants should be ready for an intercultural experience and interested in developing youth work activities aiming at fostering civic and human rights. Attending participants should be willing to become agents of change in their organisations and communities.

Participants will be selected by the coordination team according to their Application form. Previous experience, youth work background and potential to develop concrete follow-up will be specially taken into account.





# Application Procedure

Applications should be sent before the 22nd July 2018

The preparatory team will select the participants on the basis of the profile outlined above and ensuring a balanced group (gender, geographical regions, different types of experiences, cultural backgrounds and organisations).

Selected candidates will receive the course documentation and further technical and educational information directly from the organisers. A waiting list may be established.

# Financial Arrangements

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In order to support the participation of participants from the Mena region, maximum reimbursement amounts will be established. The 70 % of travel expenses will be reimbursed (on presentation of the relevant receipts).

Full board and accommodation for the duration of the Training Course will be provided and paid for by the Organisers

An enrolment fee of 45€ is payable by EU countries participants and 35€ by participants from non-EU countries. This amount will be deducted from the amount to be reimbursed for travel expenses or paid at the beginning of the course.
