Dear friends and colleagues, the Norwegian DRH Foundation is happy to invite you to apply for participation in our upcoming international training course "**M3** - **management**, **marketing and money for youth work organisations**".

"M3" is a 7-day-lasting international training course on management, marketing and finances for organisations working with youth and international youth mobility. The training course is targeted at managers in youth work, and takes place from May 24th to June 1st (including travel days) of 2019 in Hornsjoe, Norway. Funding is provided through the Norwegian National Agency for **ERASMUS+:** Youth in Action, Key Action 1, Mobility of Youth Workers.

The deadline for receiving your applications is Sunday, April 28th. Please note that in each eligible country, we have an official partner organization who will be informed about your applications and who have a say in the selection process of participants (see list below). You will be informed about the selection results on April 29th.

As during the training course there will be daily opportunities to apply the learning points of the day into a business and development plan for your organization, we especially encourage existing teams in organisations to apply for participation in this training course!

... profile of participants

We are targeting **staff and volunteers in a managerial position in youth work**, youth work organisations and educational mobility projects. Participants must be aged 18+ and be residents in the country of the nominating partner organisation. Participants should be **fluent in english**, and be willing and **committed to work hard** (about 9 hours per day at least). Participants should furthermore commit to **carry out agreed preparatory tasks** and be willing to **follow-up on the training course** via active youth work, ideally in co-operation with their sending/partner organisation.

Also, we would like to underline once more that we especially encourage existing teams in organisations to apply for participation in this training course!

. . aim, approach and outcomes

In this international training course, we will deal with how to ensure quality, stability, sustainability and visibility in our projects and programmes. Many times drawing from approaches in the sector of private economy and adapting them to the necessities and realities of our Civil Society Organisations, we will better know our "products", our potential clients and how to reach them, our supporters, the environment/market we operate within, and how we can position ourselves in this market and raise the visibility and appreciation of our work.

We will analyze our own structures, our working procedures/processes (e.g. related to decision making, information and implementation), and our planning and controlling mechanisms. We will introduce management tools that can help ensure quality and sustainability both of projects as of the organisation as a whole and thus allow **long-term planning and strategic development**. We will deal with some important aspects of financial management such as fundraising, budgeting, accounting and controlling. And we will touch upon **social entrepreneurship, digitalization and the use of social media**.

Frontal inputs will provide the theoretical background and the introduction of **practical tools**, which will then be immediately **tried out in the framework of exercises**, **simulations**, **and** – **most importantly** - **with reference to the cases of our own organisations and our respective activities**. Every day will be round up by the possibility to **apply the learning points of the day into a business and development plan for the organisation**. Therefore, **existing teams in organisations are especially encouraged** to apply for participation in this training course! A minor part of the training will also be dedicated to the ERASMUS+ programme and to the **fostering of future projects**.

.... impact, dissemination and follow-up

The participants and the partner organisations are expected to ensure the following and **provide proof of it within 3 months after the training course**:

- disseminate and promote the project and its outcomes,
- **transfer the competences** developed at this training course to further organisations, managers and leaders in youth work, and
- implement the learning points through a business and development plan for the own organization, and
- **implement concrete follow-up activities**, thus providing opportunities with and for young people in their regions and countries.

••• the venue

We are located in a hotel in the mountains, approx. 30 km away from Lillehammer. The hotel is called "Hornsjø Høyfjellshotell" (*http://www.hornsjoe.com*). You will be accommodated in rooms of 2-4 participants of same sex. Bathrooms and toilets are available in each room. Bed linen and towels are provided by the hotel. There is wi-fi available. There will be 3 meals and 2 coffee breaks per day provided.

· · · conditions of participation

The training course will start with dinner and evening programme on May 24th and end with breakfast on June 1st. Thanks to funding provided by the ERASMUS+ programme through the Norwegian National Agency, during this period all costs for food, accommodation, local transport and course materials are covered.

You are free to arrive to Norway some days earlier or stay some days longer, as long as the total amount of your extra days outside of the programme activities is not more than three days. The costs of your potential stay in Norway outside of the period May 24th evening to June 1st morning have to be borne by yourself and are not covered by the organisers.

Following the rules of ERASMUS+, **the costs of your international travel are covered up to the following total amounts** (if you prove that your travel falls into the corresponding distance band). Costs exceeding the indicated amounts have to be borne by yourself. Furthermore ...

- a participation fee of EUR 50 is to be paid in cash in Norway
- you are in charge of arranging your own insurance for your travel and stay in Norway
- full participation in the programme from evening of May 24th to morning of June 1st is mandatory to be eligible for the reimbursement of travel and subsistence costs, you cannot arrive later or leave earlier from/to the venue
- the programme will be very intensive and there will hardly be any free time. Should you wish to do some tourism, relax, travel around etc, be advised that this is NOT part of the programme, and can only be done on your private costs if you arrive earlier or stay longer after the training course
- you will receive your travel reimbursement only after having filled the evaluation form, participant survey, and having provided evidence on your dissemination and follow-up activities
- we also have some money available for **visa costs** if you need, please contact us beforehand if you need visa so we can work out how to best support you.

. •• travel arrangements

The closest airport is Oslo Gardermoen (OSL), and we advise you to book tickets for this airport. There is another airport Oslo Torp (TRF), but it is much further away. It can be an option in case of using a low-cost airline. From both of the airports you can book train tickets to Lillehammer, from where we will organise a pick-up to Hornsjøen, where the training course will take place. You can check the schedule of trains at *www.nsb.no/en*.

The journey from Gardermoen airport to Lillehammer takes about 2 hours and trains run every hour. From Torp airport, trains run every hour as well, but you will have to change trains in Oslo, and the journey might take up to 5 hours, depending on connection time in Oslo.

Please bear in mind that you will also have some travel costs inside of Norway to reach the venue, which are part of your travel budget. We will support you in arranging group and discount tickets. Do not arrange any travels before hearing the results of the application and selection process on April 29th! The selected participants will receive further information from us on how to arrange the travel to and within Norway.
