PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The aim of this project is to increase gender awareness in activities with youth performing by social actors in Europe.

IOGGA is a Training Course that involve 28 participants over 18 years old from 9 countries. It will take place in Hungary in Felsőörs managed and hosted by Anthropolis Association. The activities will be on **9**th – **15**th **September 2019**, 7 days of workshops including travel days.

The specific objectives of IOGGA are:

- to analyse the phenomenon in Gender equality in local community of the participants comparing to the European level;
- to lay the foundation for a better intervention on local and international level;
- to lay the foundation for a better understanding the educational consequences;
- to increase the capacity of the reflection in the social environment of the participants;
- to reflect on personals stories and stereotype in our social environments;
- to increase the sensitiveness in the psychological aspect;
- to give educational insight into practical tools, reflections on proactive methods, exchange of good practices with Non-formal education methods;
- to give proper tool how to design specific, gender-equality related Erasmus+ program
- to increase the international cooperation: networking and advocating, to create the best condition for mutual understanding.

PROFILE OF PARTICIPANT

This project is for youth worker, teachers, youth leaders, facilitators, trainers and anybody else who is considerate social actors of the society and interested on the topic, able to develop follow ups and dissemination of the project. There is no age limit for the participant, minimum age requested is 25 years old.

To participate you should fill the registration form not over **28th July, 22:00 CET** and the communication of the selection will be on 30th July.

HOW TO ARRIVE IN BUDAPEST

We expect the participants **to arrive until 16.00 on the 9th of September**. It is the safe timing to catch the transfer bus – project provides – to the venue. On the way back at **15th September** there will be also transfer bus provided by the project from Felsőörs to Budapest too, with the latest **arrival time at 14.00**.



Before to buy the tickets send the proposal to iogga.project@gmail.com and wait the confirmation.

The meeting point will be at 17:00 in **Blaha Luiza tér** in front of SPAR supermarket. A private bus will wait there to collect all the participants and to go to venue of the training course. Blaha Luiza square is very well connected with Metro2 and many public transportations. You can check easily google map how to reach there and the website of Budapest public transport https://bkk.hu/en/news/.

If you come by airplane at Liszt Ferenc

International Airport Terminal 2, you have 2 options:

The tickets you can buy in the specific shop BKK public transportation company or at the machine.

The cost of one ticket is **350 HUF** and it is valid for 1 way and 1 bus, if you have to change bus or metro you need 2 tickets, please ask and keep the invoice for the reimbursement.




If you come by bus, the international bus station is in **Népliget**, you need to take 2 trams:

- Tram 1 direction Bécsi út / Vörösvári út just 2 stops;
- Tram 28 direction Blaha Lujza tér M it is the last stop.

If you come by train, it depends which train station you will arrived, mainly the international trains are in **Keleti train station**. It has good connection with the meeting point because has the Metro2 with only 1 stop.

- A. the <u>bus 100E</u> to get off the second stop called Astoria and then you can walk to the place (be aware that this bus has special ticket and price);
- B. the <u>bus 200E</u> and get off at the last stop, take the bus Metro replacement bus M3, get off to the last stop, take the metro M3, get off to Erzsébet tér Metro station and then take metro M2 to Blaha Lujza to the **Örs vezér tere direction**.







VENUE AND ACCOMMODATION

The training course will take place in **Felsőörs**, a village in Veszprém county, Hungary. It is not far from Veszprém, the ancient royal center for the Hungarian Queens. It is 121 kms far from Budapest, 11 kms from Veszprem and 4,5 kms from Balaton Lake.

In Hungary the currency is **Forint** (HUF) and the exchange rate is around **1€** = **322,64 HUF**, it depends from which bank you have or exchange, but the official website is http://ec.europa.eu/budg/inforeuro.


The accommodation will be in **Snétberger Music Talent Foundation** (Snétberger Zenei Tehetség Központ) comfortable and elegant buildings will wait you in beautiful natural surroundings. Next to the forest and the creek, you will be hosted in bedrooms or apartments of 2-8 people each. The common area has natural silence and a fire-place, the training rooms and other facilities are in the same building structure.

Snétberger Music Talent Foundation is the best outcome ever in Hungary helping young Roma musicians to develop their music skills and reach their career goals. Every year they have 800 candidates scouted, 300 students complete the programme and 100 hours of concerts.
