Global Coaching is an educational program consisting of 2 separate training courses:

TC1, held by Egyesek, focused on coaching and mentoring tools TC2, by PeaceWorks, is about global justice and education

- Participants from TC1 will be given priority in the recruitment process

WHAT IS TC2?

A unique training course about global justice, with the purpose of increasing awareness and knowledge about global power structures and injustice.

WHAT IS THE AIM?

To make youth workers within the civil society sector aware of themes like democracy and oppressing structures such as:

- racism
- imperialism
- economical inequality & injustice

WHAT CAN YOU GET OUT OF IT?

- Intersectional knowledge about global justice, oppressive structures and democracy.
- Concrete tools in planning, implementing and evaluating projects aiming for social change.
- Increased knowledge about gender structures.
- Understanding the implication of volun-tourism: a critical perspective on charity work.
- International solidarity how can we collaborate?

ALSO, EXPECT

- Self-reflection about one's position of power in relation to one's target group.
- Reflecting upon the implication of social work and volunteering in a post-colonial world.
- Critical reflection of social norms while understanding that they are not intrinsically bad.

METHODS USED

INTERSECTIONAL LEARNING

- understanding that different types of power structures and oppression overlap and coexist.
- exploring how to apply intersectional methods into social work and projects

INFORMAL LEARNING

- learning from each others real working experiences
- combining theoretical learning with somatic-and systemic work (read below)
- learning through tools provided by amongst others popular education

Practical learning

- project management tools including planning, implementation and evaluation of projects

SYSTEMIC WORK

- focusing on relationships, e.g. between "youth worker" and "target group"
- includes reflexivity over one's relation to the target group
- understanding that individuals are embedded in a social context tinged by power structures

SOMATIC WORK

- integrating emotional, mental, physical and spiritual aspects of humans
- since the training will be intense, exercises to process and keep in touch with ourselves are important



PARTICIPANTS' PROFILE

The training is targeted for people who are involved in youth- and civil society work.

THIS TRAINING IS FOR YOU, IF ...

- You are a youth worker who has been working directly with young people for at least 6 months
- Your target group involves young people with different social backgrounds
- You are willing to reflect upon local and global power structures, as well as your role in reproducing them
- You are over the age of 18

PROGRAM OF THE TRAINING

Theoretical framework

Presenting, discussing and analyzing the theories that the training is founded on.

Reflexive framework

Constantly developing awareness about one's position in relation to one's target group

Practical framework

Developing social projects based on learnings from the theoretical and reflexive framework

PROGRAM OF THE TRAINING

The different frameworks presented above are not linear, meaning that we will work on them simultaneously during the training. The training also follows the principles of non-formal learning.

TRAINERS



Nasma Salim

Nasma is the Coutry Director of PeaceWorks and has developed workshops in global justice and solidarity. She has done research in management of social organisations. She also has experience in international youth- and civil society work in subjects such as peace education.



Rafaella Gärde

Rafaella is the coordinator of the training and holds a bachelor in Peace and Development studies. She has developed several workshops for PeaceWorks and a podcast regarding gender structures. She also edited a book about toxic masculinity written by Swedish youths.

PRACTICALS

VENUE

The program will be held at the campsite/conference center Tété-a-tété in Hävla, a small village located around 200 km South-West of Stockholm.

You will be accommodated in three different cottages containing several 3-4-6 bedded rooms. Every cottage has its own shower, toilet, kitchen and sofa area. In the main building of the campsite you can find the training room and dining area. A big garden around the accommodation with a basket- and beach volleyball court is also available. A small beach is located two minutes from the campsite.
