



CONTEXT

The project is designed in accordance with the objectives, priorities and important features of the Erasmus+ Program. Particularly, **it will increase opportunities for professional and career development of youth workers and youth leaders and improve their competences regarding soft skills.**

The training course "Soft Skills for Youth Workers - SSW" will involve **32 youth workers and representatives of NGOs** from 9 program countries (**United Kingdom, Italy, Portugal, Bulgaria, Lithuania, Estonia, Poland, Spain, Turkey**).

STRUCTURE

During the **9** days, participants will be active in **training course** which will consist of the following phases: getting-to-know each other and integration activities, setting common ground (presentation of the program, aims and objectives of the program, presentation of Erasmus+ introduction to Youth Pass Certificate, presentations of NGOs of participants, theoretical phase definition of **Soft Skills**, **sharing the good practices of soft skills implemented life, how in 21st century**; **soft skills are important both for our daily life and professional life**, planning of follow-up activities and evaluation of the project activities.

PROGRAM

Activities will take place in an international environment where non-formal methods will be used as educational methodology. There will be short energizers implemented to increase the energy level of a group and help the brain access its imaginative side. Reflections will happen in a group context as well as individually. Simulations will take place to understand common questions and behaviors related to the topic and discussions will take place in small and big groups over the topic and related areas.
