30.06.-05.07.2022 in Bankya, Bulgaria

Would you like to realise your own ideas?

Have you been wanting to initiate your own project?

You (and eventually your team) are ready to rock, but you just don't know yet how to get there and realise your idea(s)?

Well... read this call carefully and – if interested – join us!







We are inviting you to create a network to connect with other volunteers, NGO staff or activists from all over Europe and with partners across branches. We want to create a platform to inspire each other and learn together to strengthen our project management capacities.

Aims and Goals:

- Exchange with international youth workers, activists and volunteers about pressing topics in Europe that urgently need more attention, e.g. forced migration and refugees or social exclusion
- Exploring Social Entrepreneurship as a tool for social change and just society
- Learn from each other how to improve the processes of planning, preparing and implementing projects to tackle these topics
- Develop ideas into concrete project concepts while learning from existing local and international projects, best practices and from the field of NGOs and Social Entrepreneurs
- Build a support network to find synergies among project teams and to build on knowledge existing in networks and organisations
- Use project management tools to develop, plan, implement, monitor and evaluate projects' impacts.

The seminar will gather 30 participants from about 17 countries. The final selection of the participants will be done by the coordination team upon recommendation by the project partners.

Outcomes of Project Café (Activity 3):

- Project evaluation tools
- Ideas implementing projects sustainably; drafting follow-up project concepts
- Internationalisation of projects
- Identifying organisational and regional challenges supporting volunteers in realising project ideas (drafting first recommendations to SCI/CVS in order to overcome organisational and regional challenges)
- Tips and tricks on projects with asylum seekers and refugees, social inclusion and social entrepreneurship.
- Develop own concepts of a project, including needs and risks assessment, project writing, funding, implementation, visibility/PR, monitoring, evaluation and impact assessment.

We want to support you to develop your ideas, realise your own project and to implement it in your local community and/or organisation. We are open to support any form or idea in a broad "project" sense. For example, we can imagine supporting you to organise youth exchanges, local activities, local or regional campaigns.

Basic Facts:

Project Café is an in-depth training cycle with three seminars:

- Seminar 1: Project Pub Networking and Inspiration (December 2019 in Berlin, Germany)
- Seminar 2: Project Hub Combination and Integration (February 2020 in Sremski Karkovci, Serbia)
- Seminar 3: Project Café Project creation from inspiration to action (30 June 5 July 2022 in Bankya, Bulgaria).

This Call for Participants that you are looking at is for the third seminar. By applying to this call you apply to take part in the **Project Café – Project creation from inspiration to action.**







Overall Project Outcomes:

- The project will find synergies among participating partners on local and international level as well cross-sectional
- Identify organisational challenges and first approaches how to overcome this friction
- Finding a first Strategic Approach what organizations need to improve their capacities, and to provide a fruitful environment for their volunteers to support them transforming ideas in to action and projects

Participants will understand how to formulate quality and quantity criteria and know how to design a community assessment identifying needs and target groups

- A better understanding how to learn from entrepreneurial approaches to realise a sustainable development of ideas
- A better understanding how to tailor projects for asylum seekers and refugees integration.

All methods will be non-formal based such as World Café, Creative Storytelling, Living Exhibitions, etc. The success of the seminars for everyone depends on the active participation of everyone present. This is not a one-week lecture!

All participants selected for this project must meet the following criteria:

- Be able to attend for the full duration of the seminar
- Ideally be active and be able to influence decisions of their sending organisations and have experience in volunteering, and related topics, such as Climate Justice, Gender, Social Inclusion, Human Rights, Community Development...
- Be willing to commit yourself to spreading their new skills and competences to your sending branch in whatever capacity
- We expect participants to actively contribute to this outcome after the Activity by writing short reports about their learnings and activities, and to share them with SCI-D, CVS and their sending organisation
- Bring ideas for workshops, methods, tools, best practices and approaches to be shared
- Be 18 years old or older
- Be able to work in English language
- Be motivated and sensitive to work with people from different backgrounds

This call for participants applies only for youth workers, activists and volunteers from Albania, Armenia, Austria, Belgium, Bulgaria, Czech Republic, Estonia, Finland, France, Georgia, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Ireland, Italy, Kosovo, Moldova, Montenegro, Netherlands, North Macedonia, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Serbia, Slovenia, Slovakia, Spain, Sweden, Turkey and Ukraine.

You can apply if you have a residence in one of those countries or hold a passport from one of them.

Practical Information:

All accepted participants will receive a detailed Infosheet upon confirmation.

Conditions of participation

- Breakfast, lunch, dinner and breaks during the training duration is included
- Insurance will be provided by the organisers. The participants need to bring European Health Insurance Card.
- All participants will receive Youthpass upon successful completion of the seminar.
- A small participation fee might apply depending on your sending organisation.
- Reimbursement of the **travel costs** will be 100% up to the maximum amounts indicated in the rules of the Erasmus+ programme after the receipt of original documents (maximum travel reimbursement amounts: 100-499 km = 180 euro, 500-1999 km = 275 euro, 2000-2999 km = 360 euro).
- Covid-related costs (vaccinations, tests, masks) will be covered by the participants themselves and will not be reimbursed by the organisers.

The Venue

The training will take place in Hotel Complex Jeravna, which is situated in Bankya (Bulgarian: Банкя) – a small town and hot springs spa district located on the outskirts of Sofia.
