Less and less people live in rural areas

Dominant narratives create the frameworks in which political decisions are considered acceptable



INRUN aims to contribute to generate and inspire **new inclusive, real, endogenous rural narratives**, starting from a collective historical memory and, at the same time, with a look towards the future.

 b) to experiment with the tools of participatory documentary and digital storytelling in working with young people




OBJECTIVES

A 7 days training for youth workers (6th-12th of June)


Arrivals: 5th of June, before dinner **Departures**: 13th of June, after breakfast




1 practical workshop on how to use the **participatory documentary and digital storytelling** as a tool for generating new rural narratives


Informal moments in **nature context** in order to **share experiences** and build new networks

Collective production of **4 videos and 1 guide for youth workers** on participatory documentary that will be presented in an important summer **film festival** on environmental and sustainability issues (Cinemambiente), with a **live streaming** open to all interested youth workers in Europe

A short description of the practical **workshop on how to use the participatory documentary and digital storytelling** (by the facilitators)

"During the workshop participants will be invited to share their experiences of life in the rural world supported by a **story circle**. Within these stories, a series of common themes will then be identified around which participants will form **working groups** whose task will be to **explore the rural world** in search of dialogue and confrontation through audiovisual language. The result of these encounters with the territory will be a series of short videos made with the technique of "digital storytelling" that will include **footage shot** by the participants with means that are easily accessible to them (smartphones or similar), archive materials both visual and audio in combination with the voices of the participants who will tell their stories. The editing of the videos will be carried out by the workshop facilitators in continuous dialogue with the participants, with the aim of presenting a first version of the editing already by the end of the main activity. The whole process of making the videos will be understood as a process of research and building a relationship with the surrounding **reality** in which the questions that arise are more important than the answers and the quality of the experience of all the people involved is more important than the realisation of a standardised product."



About costs
