ABOUT THE PROJECT

Increasing young people's engagement in democratic life is of central importance to our democracy and indeed the continued legitimacy of Europe's political processes as a whole.

Fostering young people's engagement in civic society has therefore emerged as a key priority of the European Youth Strategy. Particularly through local, national and transnational Youth Participation Activities, which are eligible for funding under the current Erasmus+ Youth programme (2021-2027).





- But what do we understand concretely by "Youth Participation"?

- How can we engage more young people in democratic life and provide them with the resources to make their voice and opinions heard?
- And what kind of examples can we draw on for inspiration, when it comes to participatory activities involving young people?

REIMBURSEMENT

Travel costs will be reimbursed within 3 weeks after the project by banks transfer in euro. The travel distance represents a single way distance from the place of origin to the venue, whereas the amount covers the contribution to the return travel to and from the venue

We especially welcome participants who have fewer opportunities on account of their background, ethnicity, gender or sexual orientation.














TRAVELLING TO BERLIN

A good option for those traveling long distances is the Interrail 4-day global pass for €194, allowing you two travel days to arrive at the project and to return home. If you choose to travel a systainable way we can reimburse you for up to €30 each way to cover additional costs for food and accommodation in a hostel or camping site.


ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

The local currency is the euro, you can easily exchange or pay by cash or pay by card.

You can arrive up to 7 days before and stay 7 days after the project at your own expense.

We will be collecting a 50 euro participation fee during the project to cover additional expenses such as travel in rural areas.

Your sending organisation may choose to add an additional administrative fee to cover administrative costs of selecting and preparing participants.
