ABOUT THE PROJECT



- We are looking forward to meeting you at the "For a Better Future" Training Course!
- This training is part of an **Erasmus+ Youth Project** developed by The Romanian Secular-Humanist Association (RO), in partnership with Fondatsiya "Tsennosti, dobrodeteli, integritet" (BG) and Humanists Malta (MT).
- The project consists of the following main phases:
 - o creating a training course for an integrated approach on science and human rights education,
 - **training youth workers** to understand the connection between science and human rights, distinguish between science and pseudoscience, combat false information, and advocate for human rights.
 - o creating a best practice guide for youth workers, about an integrated approach on science and human rights education,


Our aim is to improve youth understanding of science and human rights, promote active citizenship, and contribute to the development of a democratic, inclusive, fair, and sustainable society.

ABOUT THE TRAINING



- The training will take place between **November 5th-11th, 2023**, in **Sinaia** city, located in the mountains of Transylvania, Romania.
- The participants will be **15 youth workers** from Bulgaria, Malta and Romania (5 from each country).
- Participants must be adults (aged 18+), with a strong interest in science and human rights and highly proficient in English.
- Participation is free. All travel and accommodation expenses are covered by the project grant.







Focused on experiential education and learning by doing. Will include creative thinking, sharing creative tools and methods, team work and self-assessment.



Participants will experience this training course through tasks, challenges and participation in group sessions.

ABOUT THE LOGISTICS



WHERE AND WHEN?

The training will take place between November 5th-11th, 2023, at <u>Hotel Marami</u>, 52 Furnica Street Sinaia, Romania. All participants and the organising team will be hosted there, sharing 2-persons rooms with en suite bathroom and TV. WI-FI is free of charge. The hotel is situated next to the Peleş Castle. The city center is 1 km away. The train station is 1.5 km away.

HOW TO GET THERE?

You can take a flight to Bucharest, then travel by train from Bucharest to Sinaia. There are multiple trains running all days and the trip takes about 100 minutes. You can buy tickets online here or you can buy them in the train, where you can pay cash or by card. Participants from Bulgaria and Romania can also travel by car/bus/minibus. For more information, please contact the partner organisation from your country.

WHAT TO PACK?

All travel documents; a short presentation about you and your work; an idea for an energizer; you can bring your laptop/tablet if you wish; warm clothes, a coat, waterproof shoes (*The average temperature is about 9°C and we could have rainy or snowy days*); comfortable clothes for activities inside; boardgames and books if you wish; cards/cash for personal spending (*Romanian currency is The Leu or Lei for plural, some stores and museum accepts Visa, Mastercard or Revolut*), anything else you may need.

WHAT ARE THE COSTS?

All travel, food and accommodation expenses are covered by the grant. Reimbursement for plane and train tickets will be discussed and agreed with the partner organization from your country. Only previously approved travel expenses will be reimbursed, so please do not buy any tickets until this has been agreed with the organisation, who will collect all of the original tickets, boarding passes, receipts/invoices at the end of the training. If the participant fails to provide all the necessary travel documents, we will be unable to do the reimbursement.

ABOUT THE FOLLOW-UP



- After the training has ended, the organisers will keep in touch with the participants for the **follow-up activities**.
- The participants will give feedback that will be used to develop a best practice guide.
- The participants will be **conducting 3 youth learning sessions** in their communities, by using the skills and knowledge acquired during the training course and the best practice guide that they will receive from the organisers. A budget will be granted to each participant to cover the necessary expenses. The learning sessions must take place between Dec. 2023 Apr. 2024.
- After the learning sessions, the participants will **provide further feedback** that will help us **improve the best practice guide**.
- From November 2023 until May 2024, the participants will help disseminating information about the project.


