Welcome to the world of SKAB'ing, where we delve into the concept of competence based approach trying to unravel the intricate tapestry of Skills, Knowledge, Attitudes and Behaviours. In this exploration, we delve into the core elements that shape our overlapping personal and professional landscapes. Within the SKAB'ing framework, we identified two conceptual focuses:

- 1. **For Individuals** (trainers, youth workers & educators): a comprehensive training series of four modules unpacking the ETS Competence Models:
 - a. SKAB'ing Module on Attitudes & Behaviours
 - b. SKAB'ing Module on Participation & Co-creation
 - c. SKAB'ing Module on Relationship & Learning
 - d. SKAB'ing Module on Observation & Evaluation

Each module addresses different aspects related to the application of the ETS competence model. These modules are independent, with each containing two activities and a practice phase in between.

2. **For organisations:** A strategic programme aimed at organisational development called *Transversal* based on the ETS Competence Model - **coming soon!**

With this Call we are inviting trainers, youth workers & educators to apply for the **SKAB'ing Module on Attitudes** & **Behaviours** with the following format:

- **Prep Phase:** Preparation phase with the participants' group (online and asynchronous) in the Pre-SKAB'ing Week 01.-05.04.2024.
- Training Activity 1: 26.04.-02.05.2024 in Tauchen (Austria)
- Practice phase:
 - Will be part of the co-creation process and we shape it in Activity 1
 - o Focusing on what is needed in terms of supporting your target group
 - o Could be also self-reflection and self-observation with the help of somebody else
- **Training Activity 2:** 24.06. 30.06.2024 in Weimar (Germany)
- **Follow-up:** Online Follow-up Phase with the participants' group (agreed on together)

This module is an invitation for all of us to embark on a self-exploring and self-directed learning process; we will chart our own course aiming to acquire a nuanced understanding of these complexities, enabling us to navigate the relationship effectively within the context of ETS competence models in our educational roles.

The activities will provide opportunities to explore:

- The ETS Competence Models, their dimensions and, in particular, the interplay between attitudes and behaviours;
- The Competence-based approach in non-formal education;
- Self-discovery and self-directed learning.

Learning Goals / Expected Outcomes:

Deconstructing the ETS Competence Models:

- Understand its contextual relevance, inherent biases, and interrelation of elements.
- Reconstruct in case of need for innovation.

Understanding of and Relationship building with the ETS Competence Models:

- Gain a deep understanding of the ETS Competence Models, particularly focusing on attitudes and behaviours.
- Learn how to apply these models in personal and professional contexts, enhancing educational roles.

Self-Exploration and Personal Development:

- Engage in self-reflection and self-observation to identify personal attitudes and behaviours.
- Develop strategies for personal growth and professional development in the context of youth work and education.

Co-Creation and Participation Skills:

- Develop skills in co-creating learning environments and participatory methodologies.
- Understand the importance of voluntary participation and how to foster it in educational settings.


Methodology:

- Voluntary Participation: Emphasising the importance of participants choosing to engage in the learning process voluntarily, recognizing that genuine learning occurs when individuals are selfmotivated.
- Safer and Enabling Environment: Fostering a supportive atmosphere where participants feel comfortable to participate without feeling pressured, ensuring that their involvement is always a matter of personal choice.
- Respecting Autonomy: Acknowledging and respecting the autonomy of each participant, allowing them to set their own pace and level of engagement according to their comfort and interest.
- Relationship based learning: creating a learning dynamic that takes into consideration that learning is based on trust and collaboration between people"
- *Collaborative Input:* Creating opportunities for participants to contribute their ideas, experiences, and knowledge, valuing the diverse perspectives they bring to the learning environment.
- *Co-Creative Space:* Encouraging a co-creative process where participants actively shape the learning journey, fostering a sense of ownership and deeper engagement in the learning process.
- Reflective Practice: Encouraging self-reflection and self-observation to deepen learning.
- Peer Learning: Facilitating knowledge exchange and learning among participants.
- Self-directed Learning: diagnosing learning needs, formulating learning goals, identifying resources for learning, choosing and implementing appropriate learning strategies, and evaluating learning outcomes.


Programme draft:
