

Outdoor Education for Gender Equality

Bakuriani, Georgia - March 6th-13th

While we observe a general tendency towards better **gender equality** in our societies in the past decades, many forms of discriminations and inequalities persist and need to be tackled. **Outdoor education** and outdoor activities in general are not exempted of such inequalities, with gender socialization tending to trap gender minorities and women in the « indoor », rather than opening them to the « outdoor ». Training youth workers in order to make them able to implement **inclusive** outdoor activities or sports can create positive tendencies and develop good habits that would benefit the youth sector, the EU and its neighboring countries.

Outdoor Education for Gender Equality



AIM : Addressing **gender-based inequalities** and **discriminations** in and through **outdoor activities** and **non-formal education**.

OBJECTIVES :

- Raising awareness about discriminations and their intersectionality
- Providing participants with tools to tackle gender-based discriminations and inequalities
- Training participants in order for them to create inclusive indoor or outdoor youth activities
- Formulating recommendations with participants for better gender equality in youth work and outdoor education
- Raising confidence among participants to experiment new sports and activities

PRACTICALITIES : Participants will be hosted for a week in a the mountainous region of **Bakuriani, Georgia** between **6th-13th March 2024**. Accommodation, meals and training costs will be entirely covered by ERASMUS+. Travels will be covered in the limits of the amount granted by ERASMUS+.
Participants : 18+ youth workers. Youngsters with fewer opportunities are highly encouraged to join.



Practicalities



The project will take place for a week in loft hotel Bakuriani, Georgia, between March 6th and 13th (6th is the travel day and 13th is the departure day).

Participants will be fully accommodated. Travels, meals, training and activities costs will be entirely covered by Erasmus+.

This project is for youth workers, youth leaders and people active in the field of youth and who are over 18 years old.

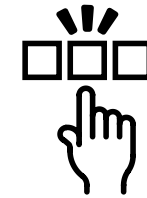

Applicants will be selected based on their motivation and notified shortly about their participation.

Travel reimbursement conditions

20 euros was cut of the travel budget to organize transportation to Bakuriani from Tbilisi airport or Kutaisi airport.

Regular tickets :

Participants must imperatively bring the original invoice, a proof of payment and their boarding pass. Prices on receipt/invoice must coincide with the price on the ticket.



E-tickets :

Participants must send their e-tickets with their name, price of the fair and details of the flight on the same page. They must provide a proof of payment (credit card receipt or bank statement). At arrival, they must imperatively give their boarding pass.

Participants need to have a health insurance and are responsible for their own travel insurance.

They should also bring their medicine and masks if they need them.

For now, all foreign citizens using any mode of travel (by air, land, or sea) to enter Georgia are exempt from the obligation to produce vaccination certificates or negative PCR test results.
