About the event

United Societies of Balkans has been implementing volunteering projects as part of EVS/ESC since 2008, having hosted more than 600 volunteers in Greece and sent more than 300 participants in missions abroad.

"Balkan Hotspot Youth Media Lab" is the continuous ESC program of USB, that has been running since 2009, involving volunteers in the use of media tools and enhancing their relevant skills. As part of its activity, the organization has also developed a network of local hosting partners, which are associations specializing in different fields of volunteering action (support for marginalized groups, non-formal education, work with children and others).

USB supports the participation of these partners in the ESC program, with its capacity as lead organization, taking care of the practicalities of the projects such as accommodation and supporting the general monitoring of the projects. Thessaloniki, Greece's second-largest city, is a vibrant hub on the Balkan Peninsula. Known for its dynamic youth culture, culinary delights, lively nightlife, and rich heritage, the city has earned prestigious titles, including European Capital of Culture in 1997 and European Youth Capital in 2014.

Thessaloniki is an educational center, home to two of Greece's largest universities, with a student population of approximately 200,000 to 250,000, making up a significant portion of the city's residents.

The city boasts a thriving urban culture and holds the title for the highest number of cafés and bars per capita in Europe. Its youthful population and multicultural atmosphere contribute to its reputation as one of Greece's top destinations for nightlife and entertainment, as recognized by Lonely Planet.

Thessaloniki is not only a cultural and entertainment epicenter in northern Greece but also holds a prestigious cultural status nationally. The city hosts major annual events, including the Thessaloniki International Fair, International Thessaloniki Film and Documentary Festivals, and the International Book Fair.

The hotel is 5 minutes from the office and in the city center.



Food

Greeks consider Thessaloniki as a gourmet city but bear in mind that this refers to the excellent local specialties and cheap-and-cheerful ouzo taverns rather than to haute cuisine or a range of foreign restaurants. Due to the fact that Thessaloniki remained under Ottoman rule for about 100 years more than southern Greece, it has retained a lot of its Eastern character, including its culinary tastes. Spices in particular play an important role in the cuisine of Thessaloniki, something which is not true to the same degree about Greece's southern regions.

A light breakfast will be provided at the hotel in the mornings.

Lunch and dinner will be at a different restaurant each day as we will be around the city and in Halkidiki, so we will inform you accordingly when you're here. Meals will be arranged respecting participants' alimentary needs.





Traveling to Thessaloniki

ThessalonikiInternationalAirport"Macedonia" (SKG) is located 13 km southfrom the center of Thessaloniki, at Thermi.

Getting to the hotel

To get to the hotel, you will need to catch the 01X bus (KTEL-AERODROMIO) line which connects the airport with the city center (if you arrive after 24:00 you get the line 01N which operates the same route for night hours). The bus stop is 2' walk from the arrivals terminal.

The line operates every 25'-30'. Ticket costs 1.80 EUR, you can buy the ticket from the machines inside the bus (you'll need cash and the machine **doesn't give change**), or from the kiosk next to the bus stop.

Your stop is **ARISTOTELOUS SQUARE (PLATIA ARISTOTELOUS IN GREEK)** and it will take around 45'-1 hour from the airport. After you get off at the stop, the hotel is approximately 5' on foot.

Travel budget

Participants will have travel budget and will be reimbursed accordingly with the Erasmus+ guide. In order to receive reimbursement they will provide United Societies of Balkans with all necessary travel documents (boarding passes, booking confirmations, physical tickets) as foreseen, that includes all means of transport they may use.

Travel budget is calculated based on the official distance brands listed below:

- 10 and 99KM: 20 EUR per participant
- 100 and 499 KM: 180 EUR per participant
- 500 and 1999 KM: 275 EUR per participant
- 2000 and 2999 KM: 360 EUR per participant
- 3000 and 3999 KM: 530 EUR per participant
