Sierra Leone ranks as #180 (Low) out of 187 countries and territories in the Human Development Index, according to the United Nations 2011 report. Thousands of families live in poverty and hunger. An estimated 62.79% of the population lives below the international poverty line (World Bank, 2011).

Children are the most vulnerable, having to work from an early age to increase the family income. In many cases they are removed from school because their families cannot afford to pay school fees along with other basic living expenses.

Our aim is to fight these issues child by child. By providing education, health care, nutritious food and clothing we hope our children will move from deprivation and sexual and criminal exploitation to being future ambassadors of a proud Sierra Leone.

- (i) Provide sustainable education and care to orphan and underprivileged children.
- (ii) Provide education, training and empowerment techniques to the surrounding female and male communities
- (iii) Provide educational materials and funding to struggling independent schools in the Kroo Bay and George Brook community in Freetown.

Education Changing Lives

The backbone to any sustainable development is education.

Supplying school materials and teaching services to our children in a safe school environment will help reduce the illiteracy and dropout rates. By assuring the payment of the teachers' salaries every month, there will be no need for the pupils to pay school fees. This means we will be unburdening the families' incomes and our children's class attendance will no longer be at risk.

It is our ambition to nurture the unique talents of each child, continuously encouraging them to pursue the road of education.

Healthy Growing

According to the World Health Organization (May 2012), in 2010 the probability of dying under 5 years per 1000 live births in Sierra Leone was 174 (Global average: 57). The most common causes of death among Sierra Leonean children under 5 years of age are malaria, pneumonia, diarrhoeal diseases and other neonatal causes – all easily preventable and treatable illnesses.

We wish to combat these alarming facts by establish a Contingency Health Fund to assist in transportation to the local clinic, purchase of medication and treatments payment.

Nutritious Learning

The Universal Declaration of Human Rights (article 25) states that everyone has the right to a standard of living adequate for their health and wellbeing, including food and clothing.

We will provide a daily meal and clean drinking water to each of our children, assuring their access to a nutritious diet as well as presenting them a major incentive to attend classes every day.

Clothing will be provided to our children through in kind received donations.

Long Term Impact

WYCF-SL wants to ensure its long-term sustainability. Therefore we plan to set up our own vegetable growing system in the upcoming years, diminishing our dependence from external donations to provide meals on school days.

With the help of two social workers who will monitor our children's living conditions and evolution, this project will help nurture a total of 330 underprivileged children, allowing them to arise out of poverty and hunger.

Operational Budget

As our organization does not have a steady financial income and our resources are extremely limited at the present moment, this operational budget is a representation of the essential goals WYCF-SL aims to achieve in the nearest future in order to provide the very best care our children deserve, establish and conduct urgently needed human development programs in the Kroo Bay and George Brook communities.


