Youth Line Germany's main objective is to give young people a fighting chance at realizing their full potential professionally and personally in a fast-changing and increasingly more complex world. We used to organise KA1 Erasmus Plus projects and local events for young adults (consultations, round tables).

During the global pandemic we were not able to work properly, some of our activities we moved into an online format, and some of the activities were stopped.

In 2022 we succeeded in recovering our youth work. We have new active team members, we got approved for more KA1 mobility projects and are implementing them now. Since the war in Ukraine started, we have been helping the newly arrived refugees. Our volunteers have been supporting migrants in Germany with paperwork, housing, and employment.
