


Self-service lunch and dinner will be served every day during the project activities.

#### How to Get to the Hotel from Train Station




 Walk to the bus stop number 11544 named Ankara Yüksek Hızlı Tren Garı that is in front of the train station.




1) Wait for the bus number **487-3** or **488-3** or **488** or **490-3** or **487** or **441** or **443** or **472**.

#### How to Get to the Hotel from Train Station






1) From the bus stop number 40422 named **ÇASGEM** walk to the hotel that is **accross the street**.

# How to Get to the Hotel from the Airport






1) Walk to the bus stop number **40813** that is in front of the airport.

2) Wait for the bus number 442.


3) Ride to bus stop number 40622 named **Pursaklar Aile Yaşam Merkezi** (3 stops)




#### From the Hotel to the City Center



To get to the city center after you exit the hotel turn right and walk by the main road until you reach the bus stop number **40319** named **Gül Parkı.** 

Take the bus number **486** or **439** or **440-5** or **443** or **477** or **486-6** that go to **Kızılay (city center)**.

#### From the City Center to the Hotel



From **Kızılay (city center)** to get to the hotel there are <u>different bus stops</u> where you can take <u>different buses</u> that go to the hotel. Here is the list:




