Background and Experience

Please briefly present the partner organisation.

- The Agricultural Strategy and Policy Development Center (TARPOL) is a dedicated foundation established to address and shape sustainable agricultural practices within Turkey. As a multidisciplinary organization at the crossroads of agriculture, biology, economics, andecology, TARPOL's mission is to drive strategic, sustainable growth in the agricultural sectorwhile addressing critical issues impacting food security, environmental stability, and publichealth. The foundation's efforts are centered on mitigating the effects of global challengessuch as climate change, epidemics, and trade disruptions, all of which threaten the stability of food supply chains.
- TARPOL's key activities span policy development, capacity building, and strategic initiativesthat align with sustainable agricultural goals. Working in collaboration with a wide network of stakeholders—including farmers, producers, agricultural workers, policymakers, andconsumers—TARPOL pursues an inclusive approach to developing holistic strategies thatensure food security and promote the sustainable use of natural resources. The foundationhas established a strong knowledge base and offers hands-on training programs that coverdiverse topics, including smart agriculture, food loss prevention, alternative food sources, sustainable aquatic resource management, and food safety.
- One of TARPOL's recent initiatives, the "Food Price Early Warning System," exemplifies itsproactive approach to addressing agricultural volatility by forecasting fluctuations in foodprices. In June 2024, TARPOL held a conference titled "How Prepared is Turkey's Agriculture and Food Sector for Climate Change?" in Ankara, gathering experts, policymakers, and stakeholders to discuss sustainable solutions. Such events not only raiseawareness but also foster collaboration among various sectors, reinforcing TARPOL's commitment to building resilience in Turkey's agricultural landscape.
- Led by Chairman Dr. Mehdi Eker, a veteran in agricultural policy, TARPOL's governance is further strengthened by an extensive advisory board comprising sectoral and scientificexperts. This structure enables the foundation to align closely with Turkey's agricultural policies and address emerging global challenges. With expertise across disciplines —including food safety, agricultural economics, veterinary sciences, and environmentalmanagement—TARPOL's team actively contributes to national and international initiatives that foster innovation and resilience in agriculture.
- In addition to its policy-focused activities, TARPOL is deeply invested in youth engagementand education. Through Erasmus+ projects, capacity-building workshops, awarenesscampaigns, and mentorship programs, TARPOL empowers young people

to play an activerole in addressing pressing environmental and agricultural issues. By equipping youth with the skills and knowledge needed for effective environmental stewardship, TARPOL promotes a sustainable future driven by informed and engaged young leaders.

• As a respected foundation on both national and international stages, TARPOL's mission is tofoster sustainable agricultural practices, promote food security, and drive policy innovationby engaging with all relevant stakeholders in the sector. The foundation's strategic initiativescontribute not only to economic development but also to the social wellbeing of communities, positioning TARPOL as a pivotal force in shaping the future of agriculture in Turkey and beyond.

What are the activities and experience of the organisation in the areas relevant forthis application?

The Center for Agricultural Strategy and Policy Development (TARPOL) is committed topromoting youth empowerment and encouraging youth participation in basic social, environmental and agricultural issues through a comprehensive package of structuredinitiatives. The Foundation's approach prioritizes equipping the younger generation with theskills, knowledge and practical experience needed to overcome critical global challenges, especially in the areas of climate change, sustainable agriculture and food security. Tarpol'syouth participation activities cover various initiatives:

• Erasmus+ Projects: TARPOL actively participates in Erasmus + programs and plays an effective role in supporting the development of young people through internationalexchange and Intercultural cooperation. These initiatives offer invaluable experiences young participants, broadening their perspective on sustainable agriculture and equipping them with the various competencies necessary to navigate today's interconnected world.

• Capacity Building Workshops: Regularly organized capacity building workshops serveas a training cornerstone for youth workers, providing both theoretical and practicalinformation on sustainable agriculture, climate change and food security. Thesesessions equip young people with the necessary tools to develop effective, community-oriented solutions to contemporary environmental challenges.

• Awareness Campaigns and Environmental Advocacy: TARPOL leads variouscampaigns and awareness initiatives aimed at educating young people aboutenvironmental sustainability. These campaigns, which address issues such as climateresilience, food security and sustainable food systems, encourage young participantsto become proactive advocates and conscious leaders in environmental protection.

• Youth Conferences and Forums: By organizing and participating in youth-orientedforums, TARPOL provides a platform for young voices to participate in climatechange and sustainability discussions in Turkey's agricultural sector. "How Ready is Turkey's Agriculture and Food Sector for Climate Change?" was held in June 2024. This event enabled the young participants to interact with experts, engage in critical discourses and develop a collaborative spirit to address pressing environmental issues.

• Collaborative Community Projects: TARPOL cooperates with a wide network of stakeholders to develop projects that actively involve young people in community service and environmental management. These projects promote a strong sense of social responsibility among the young participants

• Mentoring and Professional Support Programs: TARPOL brings young people togetherwith experienced professionals in fields such as agriculture, environmental scienceand policy making. These mentoring programs facilitate both personal and professional growth by providing career paths in sustainability-oriented fields.

Digital Learning Initiatives: Through the "Digital Agriculture Academy", TARPOL offers digital learning resources that enable young people to explore critical topicssuch as smart agriculture and technological innovation. These resources are crucial in preparing the younger generation to take advantage of digital tools to address theevolving agricultural challenges.

• Hands-On Training and Internships: TARPOL provides internship and practical trainingopportunities, immersing young individuals in applied agricultural and environmentalscience. These experiences deliver essential insights into sustainable practices, policydevelopment, and food security, preparing participants to address future challenges within the agricultural sector.

Additionally, TARPOL engages in pioneering initiatives directly relevant to this application. For example, the "Food Price Early Warning System" represents TARPOL's proactiveapproach to addressing agricultural volatility through forecasting food price fluctuations. This project reflects TARPOL's dedication to promoting stability within food systems, a subject of profound importance to youth as future custodians of environmental andagricultural sustainability.

Further reinforcing TARPOL's commitment to sustainable development, TARPOL organizeda significant event in June 2024 titled "How Prepared is Turkey's Agriculture and FoodSector for Climate Change?" This search conference gathered experts, policymakers, andsector stakeholders, fostering a collective awareness and intersectoral collaboration. Suchgatherings not only heighten awareness among young participants but also enhancecollaboration across various sectors, reinforcing TARPOL's role in building resilience withinTurkey's agricultural landscape.

In addition to events and awareness campaigns, TARPOL has also contributed to publicknowledge through impactful publications, including:

• "The Transformation Process of Turkish Agriculture – Wheat and Sheep, the Rest is Mere Play": This publication provides a comprehensive reflection on the transformative reforms in Turkey's agricultural sector, highlighting economic growthand food security advancements.

• "Feeding Dairy Cows and Calves": A scientific resource tracing the history and advancements in animal nutrition, emphasizing sustainable livestock management practices crucial to food security.

Through these diverse initiatives, TARPOL endeavors to cultivate a generation that is socially responsible, environmentally conscientious, and prepared to address the complexchallenges posed by the climate crisis. In 2011, he was awarded the Terra Mariana Honorary Rank by the Estonian Presidency and in 2012, he was awarded the "Chevalier dans I'Ordre du Merite Agricole" (Knight of Merit in Agriculture) by the French Government for his contributions to the fight against global hunger. He has many articles published in newspapers and magazines on various subjects and 2 books on the agricultural sector.

• He was elected as an MP for Diyarbakır in the 22nd, 23rd, 24th and 26th terms. He worked as a parliamentarian at the Council of Europe. He served as Minister of Food, Agriculture and Livestock in the 59th, 60th, 61st and 62nd Governments.

In 1996, he worked as a visiting scientist at Freie UniversitätBerlin and in 2000 and 2001, he worked as a visiting scientist at the Department of FoodMicrobiology and Toxicology, Food Research Institute, University of Wisconsin, USA. During thisperiod, he introduced PCR and PFGE techniques based on molecular biology to the field with his research, projects and laboratories he established. Between 2003 and 2012, he served as the Head of the Department of Food Hygiene and Technology at Ankara University, Faculty of VeterinaryMedicine.
