BACKGROUND AND EXPERIENCE

Introduction

Mundus Bulgaria is a Non-governmental Organization dedicated to promoting civic and European values through non-formal education, sport, and social inclusion. The organisation focuses on fostering integration, sustainable mindset, and active citizenship to drive positive societal change. It combines regular local activities like trainings and workshops for educators and learners while its international work is focused on organisation and system-level innovation under several European funding programs like Erasmus+ and CERV.

Objectives

- Mundus Bulgaria aims to contribute to the UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) among citizens and youth. It actively promotes the 11 Youth Goals through its permanent and project related activities.
- Develops and carries out training courses for upskilling youth workers and professionals in the fields of digital competences, sustainability, and sports management.
- Promotes "Education Through Sport" (ETS) which is a methodology for social transformation and inclusion of vulnerable groups (refugees, migrants, and youth experiencing economic, social, and geographical barriers).
- Encourages entrepreneurship and youth-led participation activities for promoting active and democratic citizens among youth and youth workers.
- Promotes strong connections to local stakeholders through a network of educational institutions, sport establishments and community centres, and other local NGOs that support Mundus's mission and values.

SPORT

Sport is one of the initiatives Mundus Bulgaria has integrated as its main priorities. We have a strong focus on applying **Education Through Sport (ETS)** methodology as a way to tackle a series of issues on societal level. Simultaneously, we are addressing Youth Goals #2 (Equality of all genders), #3 (Inclusive societies), #5 (Mental health and wellbeing), #6 (Moving rural youth forward) and #8 (Quality learning).

Our regular activities and project initiatives target:

- Gender equality in and outside of sports with a focus on addressing the leadership gap and women participation
- Social inclusion: enhancing access to sports and education to vulnerable youth groups, etc
- Strengthen volunteer engagement in sports
- Improving access to and use of non-formal education
- Using sports as a tool for active societal and youth engagement, helpful for overcoming stereotypes, encouraging teamwork, stimulating collaboration and community development

Mundus Bulgaria has developed a wide range of educational resources through its sport-focused projects, emphasising the use of NFE as a powerful tool for personal and social development. Key resources include training programmes, e-learning platforms and innovative curricula designed to enhance the professional qualifications of sports educators, youth workers, sport coaches, PE teachers and trainers working with young people and adults learners. Sport and NFE project - Handbook for educators and trainers on the specific ways they can apply Education Through Sport. Mundus Bulgaria team use this Handbook and continue to disseminate it among its NGO network yet, 2 years after the project has concluded.

VETSLAB project explored the digital dimension of the ETS methodology by creating a virtual platform for sport educators, coaches and trainers to conduct online learning activities.

These resources and their regular use in the practices of Mundus Bulgaria have significantly impacted participants and youth workers

Key Initiatives:

- Fostering Female Management Leaders in Sports (FAMS): A project addressing the gender gap in sports by implementing local training courses in sports management an e-learning platform with e-courses and interviews with experienced female leaders in the European sports sector, and a network of institutions who have widened capacity to work with young female leaders in sport.
- Volunteering in Sport (Vsport): Developed a volunteer management curriculum to enhance volunteer engagement in local and international sports activities. The project contributed to embedding volunteering practices further into sport organisations, thereby increasing capacity and volunteering values.
- Sport and NFE: Provided sports educators with clear resources to train and use the Education Through Sport (ETS) methodology, enhancing their competence in non-formal education. The training materials are used in every partner organisation and are a staple resource for trainers and youth workers.
- VETSLAB: A virtual laboratory that combines ETS with online tools, offering practical and engaging exercises for sports educators to deliver non-formal education in a digital format. Video lessons, practical methods and an online learning and working space have ensured that ETS can be applied in the digital domain and in support of sport educators/ PE teachers and trainers.
- WeSport: Promotes gender equality in sports and runs a set of local programmes for sport coaches and teachers as well as athletes and students. The workshops that were created by the consortium are multiplied on local level and adopted in the sport sector by trainers, teachers and coaches.

Impact:

ETS and NFE have been at the base of research and expertise Mundus Bulgaria brings to every project. Applying those approaches into our regular and project youth work has made sport and quality learning more accessible and adaptable to different target groups. Sport fosters inclusivity and it is a vehicle for empowerment for over the 50 youth workers and educators we train every year. By using ETS and NFE, Mundus has proven a quality international partner that contributes to innovation and horizontal dimensions of the Erasmus+ programme. On a local level, Mundus Bulgaria continues to disseminate its resources and share knowledge with stakeholders on the ways to use sport as a method for learning.

Emily plays a key role in the Sport department at Mundus Bulgaria, focusing on projects that use the Education Through Sport (ETS) methodology to promote gender equality, social inclusion, and volunteering. She develops educational resources, organises training programmes, and actively supports networking and recruitment, helping to grow Mundus Bulgaria's local partnerships and impact. Her recent work includes coordinating the creation of a Mental Well-being Training Programme for volleyball coaches under the MINDPLAY project, as well as leading ETS workshops during trainings on sustainable development, engaging youth workers, educators, and NGO professionals across Europe.

DIGITAL SKILLS

Mundus Bulgaria expertise has a pivotal role of digitalisation in a modern society, particularly upon enhancing actions and having impact on education, employability, and social inclusion. The organisation's digital initiatives aim to empower individuals with:

- essential digital skills towards better digital literacy
- promote online safety and cybersecurity
- use technology to enhance impact of non-formal education around local communities;
- enhance digital transformation and community development through

Key Initiatives:

- **Regular training courses in digital skills improvement:** Mundus has designed and regularly implements a 40-hour training course on digital skills for youth workers. Participants discover an array of digital tools and practice digital project management. The course targets not only the ability to discern misinformation, and apply critical thinking but also explore ways for social development on an organisational level (all youth workers apply their learning in their local organisations). Topics include: the use of AI; disinformation; access to digital platforms and their use in terms of information analysis and dissemination; NGOs and their digital transformation.
- **DiSCVET:** Focuses on enhancing digital security skills for VET teachers and organisations. It provides a web platform with simulation exercises on handling cyber-attacks and breaches, ensuring participants understand digital sovereignty. It also provides a Training Manual which teachers can use and train other people in their work environment.
- **VETSLAB:** A virtual laboratory for sports educators, combining Education Through Sport (ETS) with online tools. The platform offers engaging digital exercises with educational purposes, making non-formal education more accessible for PE teachers and trainers. It ensures ETS is brought into the digital dimension and further fortifies the use and popularity of the methodology among sport educators.
- **Food4Thought:** A project about urban agriculture (UA) among young people which utilises the digital dimensions and provides a series of resources online: interactive map tool for tracking best UA practices, a training tool for aspiring urban gardeners, a video library for growing different veggies.

Impact:

Through these key initiatives, Mundus Bulgaria has contributed to Youth Goal #6 (Moving Rural Youth Forward), ensuring that digital tools are accessible to all, and Youth Goal #9 (Space and Participation for All), promoting online participation and rights in digital spaces. Participants in our initiatives have acquired transferable digital security competencies that are essential across various sectors. These skills ensure ongoing adaptability in an ever-evolving digital landscape. NGOs and school staff members, trainers and adult educators have gained access to digital tools and platforms that make non-formal education scalable. Overall, in the past 3 years, Mundus Bulgaria has trained over 20 adult educators, and 60 youth workers and reached an estimated wider target group of 500 individuals.

Kristin has a great variety of digital skills, from digital content creation and digital marketing campaign leading to more technical digital skills with MS Office Package, Google Workspace, as well as digital management tools. She has experience in facilitating and training youth workers in one of Mundus' accredited KA1 training courses - Digital Skills Bootcamp. She is also in charge of Mundus' marketing and social media pages.

SUSTAINABILITY

Mundus Bulgaria promotes sustainability and environmental awareness through education and awareness campaigns. These activities aim to:

- educate young people and adult learners on sustainable practices from individual to collective actions
- promote green entrepreneurship, and responsible consumption, in alignment with Youth Goal #10 (Sustainable Green Europe).
- foster eco-conscious behaviour and empowering young people to lead the fight against the climate crisis.
- integrate the environmental aspect for sustainability across all its project activities and day-to-day operations: green transport, limited printing, supporting local businesses and promoting environmental education with internal staff trainings.

Key Initiatives:

- **Regular Training Courses on Sustainability in the NGO sector:** Mundus Bulgaria regularly organises international training courses for youth workers focused on integrating non-formal educational methods into their career development strategies. These courses provide interactive workshops on environmental, economic, and social sustainability, equipping participants with the skills to design impactful, low-impact initiatives tailored to their target groups. Youth workers from various countries collaborate to share innovative strategies and best practices, fostering cross-border networks for sustainable development. By experiencing these methods firsthand, participants are empowered to implement sustainability-focused projects in their own communities.

- **You(th)Play:** A game-based learning project using "Virtual Planet" to educate young people about environmental sustainability. It promotes eco-friendly knowledge and behaviour by simulating real-world environmental challenges and instilling a green conscience. The project introduces a virtual and a board game version to help NGOs, schools and other youth organisations to enhance their ecological knowledge and green awareness. The project's sustainability is established by having the project partners introduce Virtual Planet and the board game into their regular activities as well as having those integrated in schools curricums.

- **Food4Thought:** A project that trains young people in sustainable agricultural practices and responsible consumption. It aims to turn them into "agents of change" in combating the climate crisis, promoting local solutions to global environmental issues, especially in urban areas which have the largest carbon footprint. The project has created a training pack detailing the creation of a vegetable garden alongside marketing methods for promoting local produce. The project has empowered over 20 trainers in urban agriculture so they can kick-start their own urban agriculture initiatives and engage local young people in caring for the environment. The digital platform which collects best practices and creates an online community of gardeners is a stepping stone for the long-term impact of the project.

- **Alliance for Green Entrepreneurship (AGE)** project focused on promoting eco-sustainable entrepreneurship through the development of educational resources and training materials. Key outcomes include a comprehensive research report on green economy legislation, an Open Educational Resource (OER) platform, and enhanced competencies among adult educators to support green innovation and entrepreneurship. The project also empowers adult learners with practical solutions for green entrepreneurship, fostering a culture of sustainable business initiatives within local communities.

Impact:

In the period 2019-2027 years, Mundus Bulgaria sustainability activities are projected to impact over 1000 youth and adults, fostering eco-friendly behaviours and sustainable business models. Through youth-led participation, Mundus Bulgaria has facilitated youth to recognise their capacity for "agents of change". It has empowered local and national organisations like community centres and other associations to adopt environmentally-friendly practices on a horizontal level and it has engaged with sustainability and urban experts to promote the topic on a wider scale.

As a facilitator and trainer, Emily designs and delivers sustainability-focused workshops within Mundus Bulgaria's regular training courses for youth workers ("Sustainability: Growing with Care"), supporting them to apply sustainable practices in their daily NGO work. With a background in international relations and a strong interest in the UN Sustainable Development Goals, she brings a global perspective to local youth initiatives.

DEMOCRACY & HUMAN RIGHTS

Mundus Bulgaria has a strong background in supporting the development of civic values and social inclusion, gender equality, and participation in democratic processes. Projects in this category are designed to bring improvements within the following areas:

- gender equality,
- social inclusion with a particular focus on cultural, social and economic background
- enhancing broader civic engagement and youth participation in civil society
- ensuring vulnerable groups have greater access to civic participation
- promote visibility and civic action for overcoming cultural and social challenges and other aspects

These initiatives are aligned with Youth Goal #4 (Equality of All Genders) and Youth Goal #1 (Connecting EU with Youth), striving to build a more inclusive, democratic society.

Key Initiatives:

- Voices of Change (VOC): is a CERV project aiming to establish a European Body for Migrant Girls and Civic Engagement for a meaningful dialogue and policy discussions. A central objective of VOC is to generate actionable recommendations for local authorities and EU decision-makers.
- Fostering Female Management Leaders in Sports (FAMS): This project addresses the gender gap in sport by offering training, e-learning platforms, and mentoring opportunities for future female leaders in sports. It aims to increase women's participation in decision-making roles.
- POWER: This project examines and tackles the portrayal of female professional athletes in the media domain, fights gender stereotyping and sheds light on the capacities for countering those trends.
- WeSport: This project promotes the concept of gender equality in sports, advocating that "sport has no gender" and targets youth from fewer opportunities. It seeks to break down gender stereotypes and encourage broader participation in sports, irrespective of gender.
- Sport for Refugees: A training course aimed at youth workers to support the social inclusion of refugees through sports. It identifies challenges faced by refugees and offers practical solutions for their integration.
- Volunteering in Sport (Vsport): A project designed to promote volunteering in sport through a management curriculum that serves as a guide for effectively managing volunteers. It promotes civic engagement and active participation in local and international communities.

Impact:

From 2017 to 2024, Mundus Bulgaria's initiatives in democracy and human rights have empowered over 300 individuals, particularly women, refugees, and other underrepresented groups, by promoting gender equality, social inclusion, and active civic participation. Youth workers and adult educators have benefited from tailored training courses, gaining new tools and methodologies to engage vulnerable groups, while local NGOs have strengthened their capacity to support civic engagement and gender balance in leadership roles, especially in sports. Projects like Fostering Female Management Leaders in Sports (FAMS) gathered representatives from national federations in a training in Sports Management. Sport for Refugees has facilitated cross-sector cooperation on refugee integration and upskilled youth workers in working with such vulnerable groups.

Emily contributes to Mundus Bulgaria's democracy and human rights projects through her background in International relations and European integration and her experience in civic participation and volunteering. She has worked on initiatives like the Voices of Change project, promoting the civic engagement of migrant girls, and the POWER project, which challenges gender stereotypes in sports media. Her focus lies in creating inclusive spaces for underrepresented voices and supporting youth-led dialogue around European values and participation.

ENTREPRENEURSHIP & EMPLOYABILITY

Mundus Bulgaria places a strong emphasis on fostering entrepreneurship and employability, particularly among young people, vulnerable groups, and migrants. Through non-formal education and specialised training, these projects aim to build entrepreneurial skills, enhance job readiness, and support economic integration. They support Youth Goal #7 (Quality Employment for All) and Youth Goal #3 (Inclusive Societies), addressing barriers to employment and fostering inclusive opportunities.

Key Initiatives:

- **Young Entrepreneurs Guild (YEG):** The project aimed to tackle youth unemployment by developing entrepreneurial skills among young people, fostering a knowledge-based society where qualifications aligned with professional opportunities. By promoting extracurricular activities and entrepreneurial education, the project encouraged creative thinking and innovation. A key sustainable aspect was the creation of a Training Module, Guide, and an online platform that provided long-term access to entrepreneurial knowledge, ensuring that the project's benefits extended beyond its initial implementation. This approach helped build a cross-sectoral system that supported entrepreneurship, enabling future generations to develop sustainable businesses and career paths.

- **DECIDE:** A project targeting youth aged 18–25, helping them develop career-choice competencies for the post-pandemic world. The initiative provides an adaptive learning manual to guide the target group in making informed career decisions. The project organized staff trainings and learning mobilities for career-related decision-making. Post evaluation remarked on the improved competences and awareness for green job profiles, digital competences and interdisciplinary work skills.

- **EMPLOY ME:** Improving the employability of young second generation migrants through a series of training materials. The project achieved a number of milestones in helping this target group to integrate better in the job market. First, it created a guide for youth workers and educators that focuses on improving low-employment rates of migrants. Second, it established a virtual academy for learning and networking. And finally, it delivered an toolkit with micro-lessons in soft skills to enhance quality learning of the target group. In terms of impact, Mundus Bulgaria established valuable connections with local organisations who specialise in refugees and migrants issues. These local partners not only received the project's materials but are also using it in their day-day work on employability of the target group.

- **HUMANITY:** Targets the development of emotional intelligence and resilience in youth helping them realise their potential in personal and professional settings. 30 lessons for self-awareness, self management and social management were disseminated and integrated in the teaching and training practices of staff, facilitators and educators. The curriculum is available on a web platform and is used by staff, educators and youth workers.

Impact:

A series of high-quality training and mentorship programmes alongside digital resources have supported youth and adults in developing their employability skills further. Estimated number of reached youth and adults is 200+, which includes adult educators and youth workers who continue to multiply the activities in their own work. Vulnerable groups like migrants have been engaged and supported with practical tools to enter the labour market or start their own businesses.

Her work as a trainer has further contributed to enhancing employability skills on an international level and in the NGO dimension.

Kristin is the project coordinator of the Future Forge project - a project tackling youth employment by examining the changes of Gen Z and Alpha's learning preferences, as well as the job market trends in recent years.
