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About project

Date: Arrive on April 1 and depart on April 10

"World Water for Youth" is a youth exchange organized by Serund Pan-Armenian Youth Center". The project objective is to focus attention of young people on importance of freshwater resources and their preservation. Then sessions and workshops will take place in Armenia. The target group is formed of 45 youth workers, trainers, youth leaders from 9 countries: Armenia, Portugal, Ukraine, Russia, Greece, France, Czech Republic, Italy, Georgia.



The aims of the project are:

1.to focus attention of young people on importance of freshwater resources and their preservation 2.to voice the issue on local and international level through creativity

3.to contribute to global management of freshwater resources on local and international levels.

Armenia is a small country in the southern part of Transcaucasus. It shares a border with Turkey to the West, Georgia to the North, Azerbaijan to the East and Southeast, and Iran to the South. Armenia covers an area of 29,800 sq. km. The country's territory extends some 360 kilometers long and 200 kilometers wide, with most of the territory lying 1,000 meters to 2,500 meters above sea level. Armenia's highest mountain is Mount Aragats (4,090 meters). The sunshine ratio reaches to 2,700 hours a year.



The country is situated on the same latitude as Spain, Italy and Greece. Its climate ranges from dry subtropical to cold mountain weather. In plateaus and foothills (where Yerevan is located) the climate is dry and continental with hot summers and moderately cold winters. The average temperature in July is $+25^{\circ}$ C, and -5° C in January.



Armenia has deposits of a variety of minerals and rocks: copper, molybdenum, gold, polymetallic and iron ores, etc. The country is rich in more than a thousand curative mineral springs. There are over 215 rivers in Armenia, belonging to the Caspian Sea basin. They are turbulent and unfit for navigation but have great hydropower potential, which has been utilized for production of electricity and for irrigation.













There are more than 100 mountain lakes in Armenia. The largest among them is Lake Sevan, situated at an altitude of 1,900 meters above sea level. Forests (predominantly beech, hornbeam, oak, elm, maple, plane, ash, pine, and fir) cover about 13% of the country's territory and can be found mainly in the northeast and south.

The fauna of Armenia includes rare species of animals including roe deer, boar, Syrian bear, lynx, moufflon, bezoar goat and birds such as sparrow, woodcock, robin, warbler, tomtit, woodpecker, mountain turkey, horned lark, bearded vulture. Armenia is the first in the world with the most diverse flora, falling at one square meter of alpine meadows.







Serund Pan-Armenian Youth Center Armenia



"Serund PYC" is a Pan-Armenian youth organization, which purpose is to develop theoretical and practical knowledge of the Armenian youth, raise its role in Armenia and in the international arena. It is a platform where people can develop their leadership and organizational capacity through team work and exchange of experience. The organization promotes the responsible and organized young generation, which will retain their cultural identity. "Serund PYC" aims to develop youth potential, to encourage an open youth work and unite the Armenian youth all around the world. Serund PYC has more than 2500 volunteers all over the world. The organization operates in Armenia, Russia, United Kingdom, Georgia, Ukraine, Czech Republic, Bulgaria, Spain, Italy, Germany, France, The Netherlands, Hungary, etc.

- For better preparation, please find out what does it mean EU programme "ERASMUS +".
- Please find out what "non formal education" mean in your country and how is linked to youth work, ecology and water issues. Any examples from your country are more than welcome.
- In case you have no facebook (or other social network) account you may create one. We will work with dissemination issues via this tool.
- Remember that some of the activities will be interactive based on non formal education. Please be prepared for interaction, outdoor activities, open discussions and nice energizers.
- Local currency of Armenia: Armenian Drams-AMD, 1 Euros = 550AMD (about)
 Other currencies are generally not accepted. Banks and ATMs are also readily available.
 Alternatively, you can pay with your bank card.
- Bring materials about the NGO you represent and the country you come from to duly represent yourselves in the NGO market and national evenings (national food and drink).
- Arriving and leaving dates should be maximum +2 days. In case you are planning to stay longer or arrive earlier than the above mentioned dates, then one of the trips will not be accepted as legal expenses (not eligible). We don't cover additional days you stay in Armenia.
- Keep in mind that the project isn't for travelling and if the participants won't participate minimum 80% of the project they won't be reimbursed and the information about all the activities and participants will be send to the Executive agency.







Food

- Breakfast, lunch and dinner will be provided.
- We have a note of any special dietary requirements through your application. For those of you who are vegetarian, we are assuming you eat no fish, shell fish or poultry as well as no meat UNLESS you tell us otherwise now.
- Food allergies/intolerances have been noted and any further information you feel we need to know should be communicated now please with your acceptance of this place.
- Any health issues that we should be aware of will be kept in strictness confidence but we would urge you to notify us of anything you consider is important. First aid qualified staff are on duty at all times.

Travel

Way 1

We buy air tickets from your country to Verevan

We buy bus tickets from Yerevan to Venue (You send us 30% of the tickets and 30 Euro participation fee by transfer)

(You don't need to do business with documents, everything will be done by online check in)

Way 2

You buy air tickets from your country to Yerevan

You buy bus tickets from Yerevan to Venue
(You present all the original boarding passes and after 2-3
months get reimbursement,
30 Euro participation fee will be collected on the first
working day)

Accommodation and subsistence will be covered by Serund Pan-Armenian Youth Center thanks to the financial support of the Youth in Action Programme. Extra costs (drinks, etc.) are not covered by the organisers.

You will be reimbursed **70% of your travel costs from your home to the Youth exchange venue**. According to the rules of the YiA Programme, we kindly ask you to plan your travel with the most cost effective means of transport available. We generally do not refund individual car travel, unless there is no other possibility. We only refund the promoter directly with one transfer and <u>not individual participants</u>.

Note: the last column indicates 100% of all the costs eligible <u>per group</u>. Reimbursements will be not higher than 70% of this amount. Please liaise with your organisation to ensure your group stays within budget.







If you buy tickets yourself

Essential things we MUST have before we can reimburse your travel costs in EURO to your organisation's bank account.

You MUST <u>bring</u> or <u>print and bring</u> the following to the Youth exchange:

1. <u>Original travel tickets</u> (train/bus). You must have already translated these into English and written the translated key words on the ticket with the following affirmation:

'I the undersigned (name) confirm that this translation is true and accurate record of what is written' (sign and date)

If necessary you may stick small tickets on a larger piece of paper and write the translation on this next to the ticket.

Return tickets that you need for the journey home can be posted to us after along with any boarding passes that are not electronic.

- 2. Original receipts (invoices) for travel tickets with translation and affirmation as above.
- 3. **Printed <u>E-tickets</u>** for flights/trains/buses that have not been forwarded more than once by email with translation as above.
- 4. <u>All electronic boarding passes</u> must be printed and brought to the training course. Other <u>standard</u> <u>boarding passes</u> for the outward journey you must leave with us and post the ones for the return journey once you get home.
- 5. One photocopy of everything you give us
- 6. The attached travel summary completed with all your travel expense claims per country.



Non-eligible proof of expenditure

The following items will **not** be considered as eligible expenditure or eligible proof of expenditure and will not be accepted by YiA programme:

- Receipts or invoices in foreign languages (unless translation is provided can be handwritten)
- Confirmation of flights (as opposed to the actual e-ticket)
- Petty cash vouchers (unless receipts are provided as well)
- Illegible or poorly printed receipts
- Hand written receipts (unless additional proof is provided)
- · Excessive or reckless expenditure

Participation fee

There is a 30 Euros participation fee which must be transferred with 30% travel cost

In case you decide to buy tickets yourself the participation fee will be collected on **the first working day** of the youth exchange course. Please have this ready when you arrive.
