Background and Experience

Please briefly present the partner organisation (e.g. its type, size, scope of work, areas of specific expertise and specific social context)

Blue Umbrella represents the dream of peace and harmony between the people of Jordan and the ideology this safety, stability, employment, and education basic human rights that should be given to all. With this dream in mind, we strive to provide the residents of Jordan and all of its surrounding desert and rural areas with the support necessary to live successful and enriching life. This support is extended to the people of Jordan and their guests displaced by war, social injustice, or other tragedies and find themselves in need.

In recent years however, Jordan has become home for millions of displaced citizens/refugees from surrounding countries who are seeking refuge, safety and stability. These refugees include women and children of different religions, races, and ethnicities- totaling up to 40% of Jordan's population; and still growing. Such a high percentage has been placing a heavy burden on the economic and social structure of the Kingdom, requiring assistance with food, medicine, education and shelter, in addition to all kinds of relevant infrastructures. In reality, the majority of this growing number of refugees is largely attributed to the Israel-Palestine conflict, and the conflicts of neighboring countries like Syria, Iraq, Lebanon and Yemen. The amount of time for these continuing is unknown conflicts, while the extremist movement's continued attempts to brainwash and recruit the young and uninformed adult

refugees remain of increasing concern.

The aforementioned events have been troublesome to the Jordanian authorities, both country-wide and local, as well as to private NGOs that have been working in the field and catering for refugees basic needs. The majority of these efforts however, have only taken place within the refugees' camps themselves benefiting, exclusively, refugees residing therein; with little to no help extended to the hundreds of thousands living in slums on the outskirts, or those living in remote border areas. Those who have been abandoned continue to face extreme difficulties in their work, and daily lives, yet live peaceably with the local populations.

The organizations in place have not been as successful in providing support to those 'left-behind-refugees' and it has affected the cultural, and social well-being of both themselves, and the inhabitants of the surrounding villages and rural dwellings. Initial arguments on behalf of the Jordanian authorities and NGOs were mainly referring to the limited resources and the lack of know-how tactics in handling social fallout such as women and children trafficking, prostitution, rape, and involuntary servitude due to scarcity in employment opportunities and income. Blue Umbrella strives to provide the necessary support to these people who are so desperately in need of employment, education, and hope.
