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# ABOUT: KULTURLABOR TRIAL & ERROR

Kulturlabor Trial & Error is a Berlin based, non profit organisation, working with upcycling, D.I.Y., urban gardening, solidarity economy, youth, neighbourhoods.

We are the masters of creative and community activism, the queens of Upcycling, the experts for non-formal environmental education and youth work, the facilitators of local Kiez-swap shop and fairteiler, and much more.

We mainly work locally and internationally. In Berlin/Neukölln, multicultural neighbourhood with complex social and economical structure, we facilitate exchange and social inclusion processes between diverse youth and other groups, internationally - develop connections around the topics of environmental activism, upcycling, self-organisation and creative activism, with focus on Central and Eastern Europe. Our team has years long experience with methods of non-formal education, facilitation of groups and community processes.

We, the team - Ruta, Sandra and Kulturlabor Trial & Error e.V. collective, are youth workers and gardeners, with experience in facilitation, neighbourhoods, communities, logistics and administration, we can also cook, play games, develop publications and much more.



# **ACTIVITIES**

Project time frame: 01.08.2019. - 31.12.2020.



### A1 partner meeting

Time: October 2019, 5 days Place: Berlin, Germany

Participants: (1 project coordinator + 1 youth worker) x partner organisations

#### Topics:

- Contact making between partner organisations,
- Defining the project topic,
- Sharing sessions on A2 topics: methodology to transmit topics, for example, Seed sovereignty, Community building, Climate Change and Urban gardening, Reclaiming Public Spaces, Youth Participation in Neighbourhood etc. (Each partner takes responsibility to prepare methodology for one of the topics),
- Setting up a communication and file sharing system,
- Milestone planning, Sharing tasks and responsibilities.

# A2 Local activities: monthly meet-ups on topics related to youth work and urban gardening

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Time: October 2019 - April 2020

Place: The suburban area, chosen by partner organisations

Participants: local youth (15-25 y o) of the chosen suburban area, with facilitation of the youth worker(s) from the partner organisations

## Topics:

- Getting to know each other,
- Defining the problems of the neighbourhood through perspective of young people,
- Concept and key elements of the urban gardening,
- Input on the topics, for example, Seed sovereignty, Community building, Climate Change and Urban gardening, Reclaiming Public Spaces, Youth Participation in Neighbourhood,
- Gathering ideas of the participants on the needs, ideas for actions in the neighbourhood.

### A3 Youth exchange: Youth participation through urban gardening

Time: April 2020

Place: Partner country

Participants: (youth worker per partner organisation + 4 youngsters (selected from participants

of the meet-ups) x amount of partner organisations

Topics:

- Getting to know each other, presentations of the partner organisations,
- Intercultural communication,
- Defining the topic: 10 reasons to do urban gardening,
- Hands on practical gardening workshops 6 topics,
- Planning follow up activities.

## A4 Local gardening workshops 6x partner organisation

Time: May - October 2020

Place: The suburban area, chosen by partner organisations

Participants: local youth (15-25 y o) of the chosen suburban area, with facilitation of the youngsters, participants of the youth exchange, with mentoring and support by youth workers from the local partner organisation

Topics of workshops for local youth:

- Building a compost box
- Water management in urban garden
- Growing seedlings
- Building rised beds
- Upcycled garden furniture
- Insect hotel

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### A5 Evaluation meeting

Time: November 2020 Place: Partner country

Participants: (1 youth worker + 1 youngster) x partner organisations

Topics:

- Getting to know each other

- Presenting the process of the project activities
- Defining the learning outcomes
- Identifying strengths and weaknesses
- Identifying the potentials for follow up activities
- Closing the project

# PARTNERS: WHAT ARE WE LOOKING FOR?

We are looking for 6 partner organisations. Each of them will be responsible to send 2 youth workers to the training course. Participants should be at least 18 years old and minimum 1 from the actual partner organisation. It is expected that partner organisations have experience with urban gardening, community work and have developed youth network that would be ready to learn more about community work through hands on practises and building a sustainable network.

- **implementation** (promotion of the call for participants, spreading information about the project activities in the information channels of the organisation),
- selection and preparation of the participants of the activities, active participation in the
  project activities, providing all the necessary documentation for financial administration
  of the project, support in implementation of activities,
- evaluation and monitoring (ensuring the necessary documentation for the closure of the project, including the evaluation for Mobility tool.)
- **implementation of a follow-up activity** presentation of the project results in the home country.
