Aim of the project

This projects aims to improve the knowledge of young people regarding climate change, renewable energies and provide hands-on training program with a social and cooperative approach. It will provide young people the knowledge and the skills to promote renewable energy in their communities and to take an active role in the energy transition.

Description of the project

Energy is an important resource for socio-economic development and transition to the clean and sustainable energy is important and urgent matter for the world.

The renewable energy sources are decentralized by nature and offer opportunities for a more democratic and fair energy system, where citizens can transform themselves from being passive consumers being prosumers. They can play an active role, by producing their own energy either individually or in collaboration with other citizens through community groups or renewable energy cooperatives.

This project will provide unique, non-formal information and hands on experience on renewable energy, community building and collaborative work. The participants will take part in interactive activities, debates to understand the importance of sustainable energy and how they can play a key role in their own communities.

The project will also include Do-It-Yourself practical sessions where the participants with no previous technical knowledge build several devices. They will start speaking the same language, while feeling the sense empowerment and satisfaction of actually building their energy systems. The knowledge and the practical skills will be provided in an exciting, inspiring and fun way.

Project location:

Canakkale, Turkey

Canakkale is an important town and seaport of the Turkey and a significant centre of tourism with shores touch both Europe and Asia. The legendary citadel of Troy, the ruins of Assos and WW1 battlefields of Gallipoli are also located near Canakkale.

Accommodation:
